Legislative Coordinator: Joe Widmer – Only 2 weeks left in session and the concentration will be on completing the budget. We have a few bills that are making progress, but most will end up dead. HB 248 – Rep Reedy. Driver Education bill has had driver education curriculum in health class. You must take this course to graduate. It has been watered down to just one section in any class the school wishes. HB – 110 – Rep Seitz. Right to repair motorcycles only. It has been referred to the Economic Development and the chairwoman refused to hear the bill, committee with no vote as of today. HB 1427 – Rep Busick. Currently, auxiliary lights can only be solid white or amber while driving. The bill is not moving. SB 711 – Sen Nicola. Related to HB 1427 it has been 3rd read. There is a large transportation bill HB 799, and it could be added. HCR 5 – Rep Chappel. Profiling Resolution, not moving. HB 705 – Rep Woods took on the lane filtering bill but as he is a Democrat and Democrat bills are not being voted on. Rep Allen is new and agreed to take on the lane filtering issue next year. He is a motorcycle rider and seems to be receptive to our issues. HB 1455 – Rep. Knight – Fuel choice on vehicles which means no electric car mandate. It also includes language that will not allow cities or other subdivisions to require electric lawn or other equipment.

A coalition is being formed to reinstate a mandatory helmet law. It includes The Brain Injury Association. We must be vigilant for calls to repeal our freedom of choice. Missouri Helmet Law Repeal Coalition has a flyer available that has extremely

questionable statistics.

HB 8 – Appropriations bill that goes down and list departments and the amount of money each one receives. Under the Department of Public Safety where the MVC. We have asked for \$50,000,000 and the Governor requested \$1,000,000 veterans nursing homes. SB 59 – Sen. Cater - Survivor Benefits. SJR 56 – would exempt 100% disabled Vets. It would allow a ballot issue if passed. SB 664 & 262 will allow hyperbaric chambers for PTSD. SB 316 – Guardrails on predatory companies charging large sums to "help" obtain Vet Benefits.

MRF - Amy Allmon - MRF call to action HJR 87 and 88 to overturn regulations that was passed by the Biden administration that allow California to mandate more electric cars and trucks. These bills will help protect the Internal Combustion Engine. HR 367 - proclaimed May is Motorcycle Awareness Month. NTSA has updated its rules to allow domestically produced autonomous vehicles to qualify for exemptions from US auto safety standards. Support SB 1379 - right to repair bill that has similar language as the house bill.

**FEW Seminar** – **Trisha Ruby** – There were 100 attendees. Income: entry fees - \$2,045, games - \$41, live auction - \$1,597, silent auction - \$950, Incentive Drawing - \$215. Total Income: \$4,848. Expenses: \$1,954.58. Profit: \$2,896. When writing nomination please try to place the name of nominee and Local number at the end. The FEW was not designed to make money but educate the members. There was a suggestion to offer "scholarships" to new members. Think about it, talk to your locals. Tricia is not available to coordinate next year, so we need a volunteer. It would be great to offer the seminar to members, but we need to be able to cover the cost.

**Show Me Rally - Jim Fitzsimonds** -Site visit scheduled June 8, 1pm. Event page for the work schedule is available on Facebook. Sponsors and donations to date: \$2,500. Bands are booked; Friday night is the Happy Grenades and Saturday night Rat Pack. Still room for more vendors. Working on a wi-fi connection and Todd in Local 12 may have a solution (Starlink) but the vendor must have their own payment processor. Bike tickets are still available, need to get them sold before the July CC

meeting. Dates are August 22-24, early bird on Thursday. Single day passes are available for Friday and Saturday. RV hook-ups are \$70 for the weekend, and no hook-up RV is \$30. Shawn will be MC again, the vendor coordinator is Trisha, Doug oversees the bike games and Casey oversees the bike show. Lingerie Contest, Jake oversees the human games. Spoke with Kings Kitchen as the exclusive food vendor, using the same alcohol vendor, Donna is security and Jim takes care of potties, golf carts, and trash. The site visit will be scheduled for June 8 at 1pm. Volunteers to transport the bike to MAFR and Hootentown. Sponsor forms and vendor forms are available on the website.

#### Old Business - none

New Business – The organization has renewed our liability insurance and covered for 63 events when we were insured last year for 40 events. The agent has informed us that the meetings are covered now. We will also now pay for the Toy Run weekend, November 1 or 2, and we are covered for 52 events for this year. We need to send the insurance information a full month in advance to the agent and therefore Linda must have ALL the information prior to the event. Waivers are required to be produced by Linda and customized for each event. And completed waivers are to be sent to Linda TIMELY after the event. One day event costs \$95. An additional insured party, usually the property owner, for an event is an additional \$100. The organization pays half of the total cost for our liability insurance. Local 13 made a motion to increase the cost for one day event to increase to \$100, Local 24 2nd the motion. Discussion: some locals have already paid insurance for their event, is it fair to increase now. How many events have been held to date this year? Motion passed with 1 nay. 12 one day events have been held, Local 16 has offered to pay the \$65 to cover the insurance increase for the passed events. Two-day events with under 500 attendees the cost is \$175 and if there are more than 500 attendees the cost is \$235.

Will we be hosting a booth at the Ozark Empire Fair in Springfield, MO? Those who worked at the booth feel the cost outweighs any benefit we may have seen. We should check the cost for the Route 66 Festival.
