There will be more information at November's meeting.

MRF - Amy Allmon (Deanna Rhodes) Call and send letters regarding HB255-profiling-through MRF.org. Meeting of the Mind is in 2 weeks. A request was made to get a check for donating to MOM. <A motion was made by L14 and 2nd by L35 to not sending money to either the Meeting of the Minds or Mid-South Mile. Motion passed by a unanimous roll call vote with some discussion.> <A motion was made by L1 and 2nd by L22 to use any donations to the MRF to be counted at the end of the year for donations in kind. Motion failed by a vote of 19 no and 7 yes. There was some discussion.> Everyone is on their own to pay their way.

Mid-South Mile – Roy Hoard “Cowboy”, Tami McMinn

Mississippi has shown interest in joining the MSM. They were encouraged to start their own MILE. The next MSM is in Shreveport LA, Oct 25-27. L8 donated a wagon wheel wine rack/bar for the basket. There is also a bistro table and chairs, map of Missouri (to show donating winery's), wine refrigerator, approximately 15 to 18 bottles of wine, bourbon, cheese and wine glasses.

Motorcycle Safety – Beth Livingston There will be extra expenses this winter. Repaint Trenton course, purchase turn signals and new mirrors before the bikes can be used next year.

Membership – Jim Scheele and Mark Capps There was a discussion on revamping the trifolds during the Saturday committee meeting. The current trifolds are on the website for each local to print. www.forr.net Quick pick up items such as postcards or business cards with yearly events. A rough draft was presented of what will be on the postcards. It will have some of the advances FORR has made with motorcycle rights. MAC- Deanna Rhodes Bumper magnets are still for sale. Submit any awareness ideas to Deanna. Deanna has been talking to MODot regarding grass clippings. She will be obtaining a list of directors from across the state and county commissions to contact about grass clippings. Take pictures of electric signs you see regarding motorcycle safety.

COC Liaison – Terry Cobb, Ken Lewis Profiling was the main discussion. Voted no on letting clubs in the COC that have LEO's in their membership. Shaggy is retiring from the armed forces motorcycle club. Not sure how that will affect COC as he was elected chairman of the COC. The next meeting will be October 20th at Invaders clubhouse. The offer was made to COC members to join FORR. None that we are aware of have joined to date.

Product Line – Shaulene Capps Cinda Hankins has resigned as the product line person. The \$1000.00 allotted to purchase product line will not be used at this time. A hand-out shows some of the different designs for t-shirts. The focus is to keep the cost down. More items will be added in the future. Email productline@forr.net There are many older patches from past events. One color print, there isn't any limit as to how many can be printed. If there are multiple colors, it needs to be on orders of 75. Smaller amounts are not cost effective if in color. The printing on the sleeve of the hoodies will be printed so it can be read when arms are extended riding a bike.

FEW Seminar – Joe “DC” Karr The FEW Seminar will be March 7, 2020 at the American Legion in Jefferson City. <A motion was made by L3 and 2nd by L 31 to raise the pre-registration to \$25 to include a patch and the cost at the door will be \$25 without the patch and to purchase a patch will be \$5.00. Ideas for breakout classes can be sent to DC. DC made a challenge for each local to make a basket for the FEW seminar to be auctioned off to raise money for the FEW seminar in 2021. The each local can pick their own theme.

Homecoming – Ken Lewis There were 344 people sign-in, some were day passes. Preliminary numbers are a net profit of \$2770.10. There is still money coming in and some outstanding bills. Next year Homecoming will be August 21-23, 2020. There will be a gate set up on Thursday for early birds. Need to work on local participation. There were only 10 locals represented at the Homecoming. There will be more camper hook-ups provided next year. The next committee meeting will be held the Saturday before the November CC meeting.

Old Business <L1 made a motion L11 2nd to un-table the membership proposals. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.> <First proposal is that the membership fee remains at \$25 with CC keeping the entire \$25. Motion failed by a roll call vote of 7 yes, 15 no, and 3 abstaining.> <Second proposal is to raise the membership to \$30 and the locals retain \$5. Motion failed by a roll call vote of 5 yes and 20 nos', there was much discussion.>

New Business General office has submitted an official resignation to be effective as of December 31, 2019. There is a potential candidate to fill the position. Applications can still be submitted until October 18th. Email resumes, including cover letter, to any CC cabinet member.

There has been 1 cabinet submission which will be voted on in November. Chairman; Ken Lewis L24, Vice Chair; Joe (DC) Karr L11, Secretary; Danniyelle Finley L14, Treasurer; Kathleen (Duchess) Warner L11. The CC meetings will be moving to the American Legion beginning in January for the 2020-21 cabinet. There will be a committee room on Saturday and CC meetings will be in the main banquet room. There will be meals offered on Sunday at the cost to the person eating. The auxiliary room for Saturday committee meetings will cost \$75 vs \$300 at Capital Plaza, CC room (banquet) \$100 vs \$400 at Capital Plaza. They have an open bar for hospitality which is \$300 at Capital Plaza. That is the proposal which will be finalized in November. Motel rooms can be at the EconoLodge for approximately \$60 a night. The dates for 2020 committee and CC meetings will be January 11&12, March 7&8, May 2&3, July 11&12, Septembers meeting had to be scheduled August 29&30 and November 14&15. November 2 & 3 will be scheduled for the toy run for the state to pay the insurance. Each local must have a flyer and sanction form submitted. <A motion was made by L1 and 2nd by L5 to go back to 1st class priority mail presorted for the newsletter. Motion passed by a unanimous voice vote with some discussion.> L1 has 40th anniversary patches will be available for \$3.00 each. If locals want to purchase, they will be available at the November meet. Local checks will be accepted to be made out to L1 or cash is acceptable. There are 300 patches available.
