Notes from Bill

Yep January is about over and as I write this it has just began. So by the time you read this everything has probably already changed. The session is in full swing and bills are filed and hopefully we have hearings set to go, wishful thinking. The right of way bill was filed by Rep Hicks and it should be filed by Senator Schaefer. HB 302 is the bill number and I don't have one for the senate side at this time. They will have the exact same wording as last year. There are a couple of bills this year for the helmet modification .Sen. Holsman has filed the exact same bill as last year. Sb 135 has 21 years with insurance and the licenses plate language in it. It's not what we wanted but we will have to work with it to see what we can do. I think Rep Burleson is going to file the exact same thing. We also have a brand new representative that has filed a bill on the helmet. Rep Shane Roden has filed bill HB 310 helmet modification. The wording of this bill is that anyone over the age of 18 will have the right to choose. I will be getting in contact with him to see what his plan is and what FORR can help him with. Last year Rep Bryan Spencer filled that exact same bill and I thought he was going to file it again but will have to see what we have going on with this. We will also be watching the distractive driving bill that are filed. SB 3 filed by Sen. Pearce witch expands use of using cell phones while driving including telephone calls. HB 27 filed by Rep. Michele Kratky prohibits drivers of non-commercial vehicles from texting while driving unless it has a hands free device. There are a few more on my list right now a will be keeping you informed as much as possible. It will be a short session but it will seem to take a long time

The first all local legislative day is Tuesday February 10 so make the plans on being there. Then May 5 is the MAY Rally we will be meeting at memorial park in Jefferson City with a parade to the capitol. It is all set, we just need to get as many people there as possible. Along with these days we are asking that each local pick a day of session and bring as many people there that they can. It will have to be a Tuesday or Wednesday, the other days there is just not many people there. This would help our mission at the capitol. We need to have people there every week to keep them moving on our issues this could help. So make sure you ask your local when you will be making a trip to the capitol.





NHTSA Announces Drop in Motorcycle Fatalities

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) announced that motorcycle fatalities have dropped for the second year in a row, reports the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF). According

to the Fatality Analysis Reporting System, or FARS data, collected by the federal government, motorcycle fatalities for 2013 dropped from 4,986 to 4,668 a difference of 318. The motorcycle fatality drop was the largest percentage of all vehicle groups at 6.4 percent. This is the second year on year drop in motorcycle fatalities since 2009. This is an encouraging trend, but it is likely just that. It is a promising direction, since more motorcycles continue to be registered year after year. Another aspect motorcyclists can be proud of is the decrease in the number of alcohol related deaths. Fatal crashes where alcohol was a factor dropped by 117 deaths, or 8.3 percent, also the largest decrease in the category. Also reported was the drop in the number of injured motorcyclists from 93,000 to 88,000, a 5.4 percent drop. Eighty-eight thousand still seems like an awfully large number but consider that the number of passenger vehicle injuries is 2,046,000 for 2013. The drop in injured motorcyclists is again the largest decrease in the category. One unfortunate aspect of the report is that motorcyclist fatalities now take up 14 percent of the total fatalities. This is likely a direct result of more motorcycle licenses being issued and more motorcycle registrations being reported. Highway motorcycles saw a two percent increase in sales in 2013, and manufacturers are reporting record setting sales for 2013, according to the Motorcycle Industry Council. As with any increase in a vehicle population, it is predictable that fatalities would also rise. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation believes that through strong rider education programs and prolific motorcycle awareness campaigns this drop in motorcycle fatalities can continue. Public Comment Period: Comments Sought by NHTSA on 'ABS Failure' Warning Lamp Rulemaking

The American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) believes you may be interested in commenting on the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's proposal to change the height of the letters on motorcycle ABS "malfunction telltales", aka warning lamps. Their doing so would require a change to the related final rule Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS's) 122 and 123.

FMVSS No. 122 was first written without any Anti-Lock Brake warning lamp specifications. In subsequent versions, a yellow warning lamp was required and finally the words "Antilock", "Anti-Lock" or acronym "ABS" were required at a minimum height of 3/32" or 2.4 mm. The NHTSA is proposing to place the specification for the ABS malfunction telltale in FMVSS No. 123, Motorcycle Controls and Displays.

The NHTSA is now suggesting they use the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) standard symbol at manufacturers' current height of 7 mm for motorcycles equipped with anti-lock brakes, removing the letter height specification for the ABS malfunction telltale if manufacturers use the ISO symbol for ABS malfunction.

The agency requests comments on whether there should be a minimum height requirement for an ABS malfunction telltale that uses the ISO symbol. They describe having no reason to believe that using the ISO symbol in lieu of text labeling at a minimum height would affect the safety of motorcycles or the general public. The types of failure indicated by the ABS malfunction telltale are electronic failures that result in the loss of ABS functionality, but do not cause loss of braking ability.


