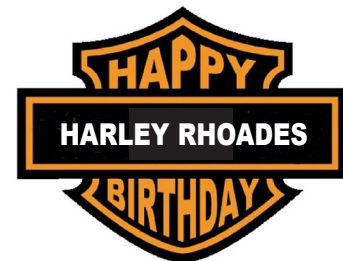

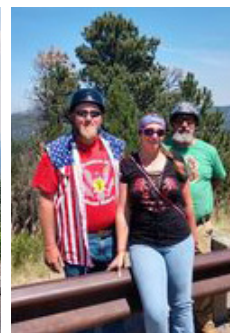

Hello, my brothers and sisters. This month, I am going to write about something that deeply troubles my heart, and that is the problem with bikers and their riders lacking visibility. We see far, far too often on the news how a motorcyclist was killed in an accident after being struck by another vehicle, often claiming “I never SAW the motorcycle!” The most common cause of motorcycle accidents is the failure of other motorists to detect and recognize motorcycles on the road. You can be the most experienced rider, have had taken multiple safety courses, ride defensively every time your leg swings over that seat. And, yet, none of that will save you if the other motorists do not perceive you.

Several statistics show that nearly half of all motorcycle accidents occur at intersections, whether that be from running red lights, vehicles making left hand turns directly in front of bikers, motorists failing to yield the right of way, bikes in “blind spots” behind other vehicles, etc. You have NOTHING to protect you in a collision with another vehicle, so visibility is of the UTMOST importance.

So, let’s discuss some of the ways you CAN make a difference in visibility whenever you are on your bike. Clothing - I know we all like to ride in our black t-shirts, black leathers, but wearing a bright color and/or reflective clothing will greatly enhance your visibility.

Headlights- ride with your headlight on High during the day, makes a huge difference. Some riders even use the modular, pulsating headlight to really draw attention.

Position Lamps- Some bikes are equipped with these in their front turn signals which help other motorists identify you as a motorcycle.

Signals- Use both your turn signals and hand signals whenever possible to communicate your intentions.

Brake Light- make sure this is working before every ride. Some bikes have the flashing brake lights, which make it quite obvious they are stopping.

Horn - Yes, use your horn whenever possible, but we all know that a motorcycle horn is “not it’s strong point.” I also rev my pipes when I need to give someone a lil’ jolt, let them know, “Hey, I am HERE!”

Fairings- Many larger bikes have fairings, and this has been proven to be helpful with visibility.

I hope these suggestions have helped make us all consider ways that we can improve our visibility to other drivers, and thus increase our level of safety when riding. Ride defensively, always scanning and alert to your surroundings, and remember...

“Keep the Rubber Side Down.”

History Lesson for the month

October 1, 1908 - Henry Ford's Model T, a "universal car" designed for the masses, went on sale for the first time.

October 3, 1974 - Frank Robinson was hired by the Cleveland Indians as baseball's first African American major league manager.

October 4th, 1861 - Artist Frederic Remington (1861-1909) was born in Canton, New York. He studied at Yale Art School then traveled extensively throughout the American West in the late 1800s sketching cowboys, Native Americans, frontiersmen, and soldiers. He also created lively sculptures featuring bucking broncos.

October 14, 1890 - Dwight D. Eisenhower (1890-1969) the 34th U.S. President was born in Denison, Texas. He served two terms as President, from January 20, 1953 to January 20, 1961. Nicknamed "Ike," he was a West Point graduate and career Army officer who became Supreme Commander of the Allied Forces in Europe during World War II. He held the rank of Five-star General of the Army.

October 16, 1898 - American jurist William O. Douglas (1898-1980) was born in Maine, Minnesota. He served as an associate justice on the Supreme Court for 36 years and was also a world traveler, conservationist, outdoorsman and author.

October 26, 1881 - The shoot-out at the O.K. Corral in Tombstone, Arizona, occurred between the feuding Clanton and Earp families. Wyatt Earp, two of his brothers and "Doc" Holliday gunned down two Clantons and two others.

October 31, 1968 - During the Vietnam War, President Lyndon Johnson ordered a halt of American bombing of North Vietnam.

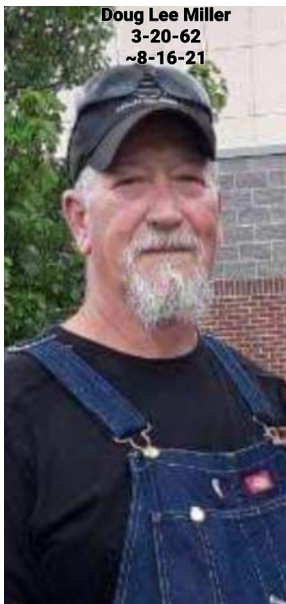

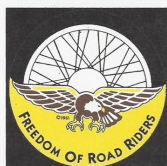
