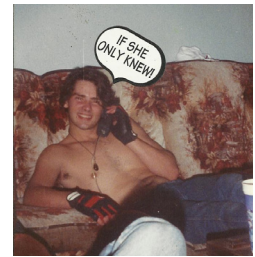

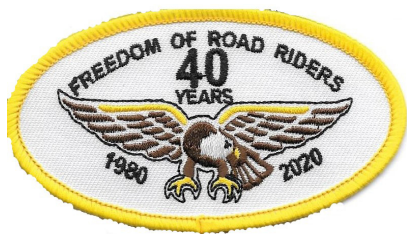

Motion to approve the minutes as written was made by L1 and 2nd by L7. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Chairman – Ken "Squirrel" Lewis

Contacted Local 21 and it was determined that they would close the local. Their financial report has not changed in many months. We have been paying \$175 for meeting hall rental for the weekend and the Legion would like to increase that amount to \$300. Local 11 made a motion to accept the increase in cost beginning January and Local 1, 2nd the motion. Local 11 asked if they had adjusted the price due to their renovation and we did not get an adjustment but that could be discussed. The cost of the hall does not charge an additional amount for the FEW Seminar, we do have the additional cost of the meal which will likely increase for this year. Local 30 asked if there was a possibility of a price lock say for the next 5 years. We do sign a 2-year contract and since the cabinet changes every 2 years. We usually do not commit ourselves beyond that time-period. Motion passed with unanimous vote. We will need the dates for 2022 CC meetings confirmed for December Freedom Press publication.

Webmaster – absent –Need a replacement for Mike. Contacting Larry Scott our previous website designer, checking with a web designer for prices to address our needs. It needs to be updated and maybe we need to budget in the cost of creating and maintaining our website.

Awareness Coordinator – Deanna Rhodes/Heather Dunham – Heather has Bikefest workers scheduled. Thanks to everyone who worked the booth at Homecoming. Deanna has been using your personal tent and table for booths since Heather is taking over, she will need these items. It was previously voted on to spend up to \$200 to purchase these items for Heather's use. A table has been purchased and Deanna's Awareness tent was destroyed at Homecoming. The purchase of the tent and table totaled \$137. Kim Lortin's 660-833-6874. Suggest a guest book at Bikefest to gather info such as: 1st time in Missouri, do you wear a helmet, where are you from, etc.

Legislative Coordinator – Joe Widmer has agreed to stay on another year and needs someone to take over and will train. Would entertain staying on if he was a paid lobbyist. In previous years we paid a lobbyist about \$10,000 and a bonus of \$1,000 for each bill passed and paid \$30,000 for one about 10 years ago. That guy did very little for the organization. We previously reimburse Joe up to \$7,500 but he has never turned in any receipts. It would be a payment in addition to expenses. Questions: would he be paid as subcontractor or employee? Motion Made by Local 3 to table the discussion until Joe provides a figure and we will vote next meeting. Seconded by Local 11, passed by unanimous voice vote. Issues that are likely to come up would be texting and driving, we support bills that are introduced usually but don't write our own. Attempting to get driver's education put back in schools. Sen. Cindy O'Loughlin is chair of Education Committee, would take it on or searching for a Senator to sponsor. We are involved to include Motorcycle Awareness. The 8yr old and under rider prohibition likely to come up again by Sen Lauren Author. We need to keep a watchful eye on bills that would reverse the helmet modification. Article on Facebook that said there were 31 fatalities in the first 6 months this year compared to 2 last year without helmets. Where did these numbers come from? Kim Archer concerned with Audrain and Mexico with profiling for non-helmet and not hiding it, what can do? Suggested to file complaints to superiors yet they are directing the harassment, Sheriff, Chief of Police. Other options would be file harassment complaints with State Attorney General or the prosecuting attorney. Complaints that there are limited amount of Deer Xing signs where they are needed in Northeast Missouri.

MRF - Amy Allmon –Meeting of the Minds Sept 23-26 is anyone interested. Asking for assistance for the trip to pay for two hotel rooms. Countered that the amount was in the budget and we will revisit the amount for the budget for the coming year to account due to our improved financial situation. Another ask would be for postage for membership renewal reminders and as 2024 approaches we can request sponsorships of other financial assistance for Meeting of the Minds. Billy Long has joined the race to replace Sen. Blunt. Rumors are the Eric Bureson may run for Billy Long's Congressional seat. Once FORR determines who we would like to back in the Senate race or any Federal election we can request that the MRF donate to the campaign on our behalf. Every Congressional seat is up for reelection so please research the candidates for your area and determine who would best serve our purposes.

Mid-South Mile – Roy "Cowboy" Hoard – Mid-South MILE will be held October 22-24 in Dallas, TX. It will be held at the MCM Elegante Hotel. We have \$1,500 budgeted for MILE and have spent \$200 for the basket and asking that we add \$1,000 to the remaining \$1,300 for the donation to the MILE to equal. Local 33 made motion to increase the donation and Local 3 2nd the motion. Local 5 amended the motion to make the MRF and MILE donations to \$2,500 from \$1,500. Roll call vote of amendment passed unanimously. Amended motion roll call vote passed unanimously. Mid-South MILE will be in Missouri in 2023.

Riders Education – Beth Clark was able to hold classes so notice the increase in the Rider Education financials. One 3- wheel class scheduled September 17-19 and a BRC October 16-17. Need instructors for Rider's Education. A Local 15 member sent the paperwork for instructor classes, and it was returned stating he needed a sponsor. Would not FORR be their sponsor? Contact Beth and we will get the answers.

Membership – Kim Lorton absent. Discussions on Bikefest during committee meeting yesterday. Getting bodies to the event and

increasing membership and aware of our presence in the State. Kim's phone number: (660) 833-6874. Booth at Lake of the Ozarks Bikefest will be placed at Summer USA next to door to The Leatherman. Contact Kim or Heather to let them know available to work the booth. Heather sent a message to Deanna that Local 2 has Friday and Saturday covered for the Info Booth and Bikefest.

COCI Liaison – Ken Lewis. COC meeting was yesterday. Ken and Mike Thompson who is in the Lake of the Ozark area. Recently, there was a fist fight that turned into a shooting, and someone died. As a result, many of the businesses began posting "No Colors" and there is a concern since many clubs will be attending. At last count only two stores still have the signs posted. Since the shooting the clubs involved have retaliated against each other by burning down the club house and the personal home of a member. Shaggy (president of COC) stated that they cannot defend those actions. The businesses indicate they are full on for Bikefest and realize, many of the attendees are not club members. The clubs that do show up are not usually troublemakers. We were completely behind opposing the "No Colors" until they started burning down homes.

Product Line – Mark Capps. Product line is closed, and it is now up for grabs. There are few items left and will be dispersed locally. The organization has no money in the product line. They are donating the trailer and some equipment back the product line just needs to be picked up. Some repairs have been made. We will not produce any new product line. Equipment includes racks, hangers, and the canopy was destroyed at Homecoming and will need to be replaced. The trailer will need a spare tire since they blew a tire on the way home from Homecoming.

Freedom Press – Michelle "Rebel" O'Connor. Handout regarding the cost of the newsletter. Features that have been included to get input from members are "Who am I?" and "My Ride." Send old pictures of members and of your bike, don't forget to include info regarding the photo: names, event (if known), make, model, year of bike. Send photos. Submissions must be received at editor@forn.net by the 5th of each month and put Local number in the subject line. Read the minutes from previous meeting and the motion stated that we are going digital and if you wish to continue to receive the Freedom Press in the mail you must notify the membership coordinator. It will be printed again in the Freedom Press and Duchess will get with Rebel for the publication of the info. This needs to be completed by November CC meeting. A check box has been added to the new tri-folds so new members can provide their preference when joining.

Social Media Coordinator – Cheryl Volmer. Our posts reached 16,000 in May on Fac Email smc@forn.net or message me on Facebook. Facebook has placed limits on the number of times she can share a single post with other groups and some groups kicked her off their page. She can work around this by following groups on the State page but it requires Local groups to adjust their settings to allow pages to join the group. Cashed in \$5 ad offer to advertise Homecoming rally 5 days prior to the event. This small amount gave us 335 views from people who do not already like or follow our page. I firmly believe that advertising our major events on Facebook and Instagram would be the most efficient and effective way to bring new people to our event and organization. Would like to be allowed to create events on the State page for Local events to increase attendance. This is not to step on any toes or push Locals out of their events but to assist in increasing attendance and profits. We voted to not allow her to create events because they would not have access to responses. It was suggested that when the locals create an event that they make Cheryl Volmer a co-host to event which would allow her extend the invites to more people.

FEW Seminar – Jammie Tipton not in attendance and no report provided.

Homecoming – Joe "DC" Karr. We had 400 people through the gate 16 more than last year. 239 non-members tells me advertising worked and 161 members why not more? when we have 1,900 members. Eight Locals did not donate time or money. One local decided not to sponsor since the T-shirt sponsors they obtained last year were not included on the shirt however that was because they were turned in after the deadline. The sponsors we missed last year were included this year. We are committed to correcting problems or making this whole.

New security protocols were a tremendous help and convincing more members to attend will bolster the work schedule because 85% of the shifts were covered by Local 11. Did everyone enjoy the slip and slide kickball, bucket pong, shock and drink game? No bike games since we had the big storm Friday night and did not want to tear up the grass and pasture. Incident reports were minimal: one where a little motorbike hit another bike bent the grip and they traded insurance info, the other was the drummer for Lovebomb slipped of the ramp and cut his leg and Terry fixed him up and advised him to follow up with his doctor.

Better numbers this year and we also spent more money but it should pay off in the years to come. I am going go over the definition of camper and the definition of a tent. There seems to be some confusion on the issue.
