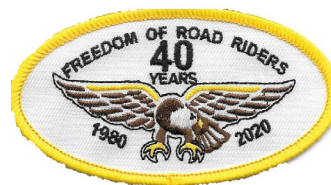
Hello District 4,

We have won the battle to have "freedom to choose" but now we have a bigger battle to keep our new found "Freedom." You need to be aware that at some point there will be legislation to repeal what we have just won.

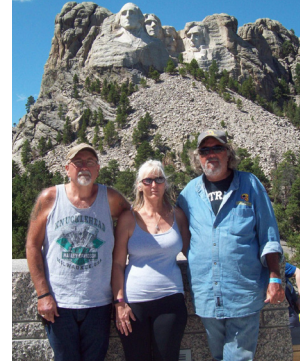

STURGIS, S.D. - COVID-19
cases in eight states have been linked by health officials to attendance at the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally held in early August.

The North Dakota Health Department tweeted that 17 people “who are connected to” the rally have tested positive for the virus.

Other cases have been confirmed in Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, Washington, Wisconsin, Wyoming and South Dakota.

The Associated Press reported more than 100 cases in total have been linked to the event, which drew a crowd estimated at more than 450,000. South Dakota does not require that masks be worn in public.
