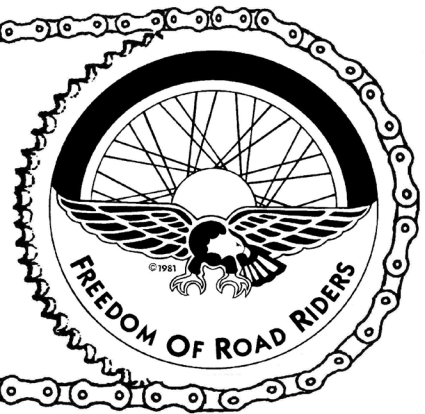

Currently Accepting Applications for the following **volunteer** positions:

Events Co-Ordinator: (**Currently done by Glenda Ely**)

Job Duties include but are not limited to: Receive event flyers for approval. Work closely with the State Treasurer to make sure the event insurance is paid. Once insurance has been paid and sanctions forms have been received, contact Bob Hawkins with information to have event insured. Send waiver to Local. Log event into spreadsheet. When signed waivers are received checkoff on spreadsheet. Post event on State Facebook page and send flyer to the webmaster to be published on the state website and to the Newsletter Editor for publication in the Freedom Press.

Newsletter Editor: (**Currently done by General Office**)

Job Duties Include but are not limited to: Receive Local submittals by the 5th of each month. Read each submittal and correct spelling where necessary, clean up punctuation as much as time allows and look for keywords that are not allowed. Look for artwork for front page (all art work must first be converted to gray scale) and filler as needed. After receiving the event flyers from the Events Coordinator change from color to greyscale and place in the Newsletter. Update Local meeting places and contact info as needed. Update Corp Sponsor art work as needed. Package final copy for the month and send to the printer for publication. Put newsletter together and have to the printer by the 9th of each month. Change up final version and take out grey scale event flyers and replace them with the color version. Replace front cover picture with the color version. Save as PDF for Digital Freedom Press. Check list of members who chose the Digital copy and make sure none are expired by comparing to the list of expired members sent by the membership secretary. Only email to current members. Email a copy to the Webmaster for the members only section of the webpage.

Rider Education Coordinator: (**Currently done by General Office**)

Job Duties include but are not limited to: Answer phone calls and assist prospective students in enrolling in R/E classes. Take credit card payments for tuition over the phone or instruct where to mail check or money order. Enter students name and information into the data base and roster spreadsheets to be shared with the instructors and site coordinators. Prepare and mail or email confirmation and cover letters to students. Prepare and email class rosters to Instructors and Site Coordinators weekly. Send payroll information for each class to the Treasurer to process paychecks for the instructors and range aids. After classes are completed, instructors will send completed roster with pass/fail status of each student. This information will need to be entered into the REMS site for MMSP. Pay quarterly insurance to MMSP. Update annual tri-fold once class schedule has been established and send to printer for printing. Email bills to State Treasurer for payment. Have tri-fold mailed to coaches.

Currently Accepting Applications for the following paid position:

General Office Manager:

Job duties include but are not limited to: Check mail (and email for PayPal receipts) for memberships, process 101 forms, update member information in data base and on 3x5 cards. Prepare and print renewal letters, new member letters and new life member letters and mail with membership cards, accompanying patches, chevrons and clings to members. Respond to members emails and assist as much as possible. Send out monthly roster to Local Membership Secretaries. Mail new and archived members list to Local Presidents each month. Send out reminder cards to expired members. Make weekly deposits and send copies of checks and deposit slips to State Treasurer to enter into QuickBooks. Notify Rider's Education Coordinator of any credit card payments received for tuition and send a weekly report to State Treasurer to put into QuickBooks. Keep log of refunds for Locals and send to State Secretary to be entered into QuickBooks and mailed to Locals. Accept credit card payments for RV spots, vendor spots and donations for Homecoming Rally and report to Homecoming Chairman as well as to State Treasurer so she can enter information into QuickBooks for Homecoming Account. Answer phone calls and assist members by accepting credit card payments for new and renewed memberships, answering questions or doing research as needed. Send State Treasurer weekly timesheet for paycheck. Prepare & email Central Committee documents for the State Secretary prior to CC meetings. Assist Webmaster as needed by keeping them informed of updates needed to be made to the website. Email him/her copies of approved CC Meeting Minutes. Assist Product Line Manager by ordering merchandise needed by product line, send invoices to State Treasurer to pay. Assist Legislative Coordinator as needed by sending membership roster when requested. Assist State Treasurer by forwarding invoices and monthly bills that need to be paid. Also send copies of all deposits made so they can be entered into QuickBooks.

***Items Currently being done by General Office that will be handled by the State Treasurer:**

Print checks from QuickBooks to pay monthly bills for general office & rider's education.

Reconcile General Fund, Rider's Education and Homecoming accounts

Prepare financial reports for the Central Committee Meetings for General Fund, Rider's Education Fund and Homecoming accounts.

Enter deposits into QuickBooks for General Fund, Rider's Education and Homecoming accounts.

Determine what shared expenses need to be paid by PAC fund and Rider's Education (GO payroll, long distance phone bill and postage if any) and print checks.

Determine the refunds for each Local for each quarter and print and mail checks.

Check PayPal account and transfer funds to bank account and enter into QuickBooks

Prepare and mail Payroll checks for General Office and Rider Education Coaches.

Pay payroll taxes and prepare quarterly tax reports.

Compile and send information to Accountant for income taxes.

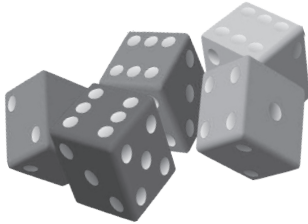

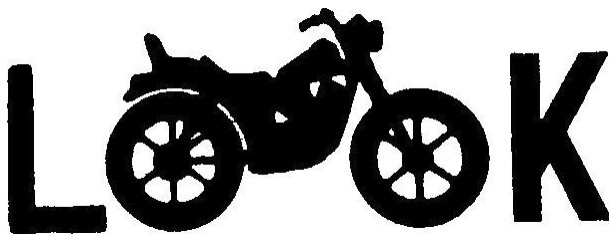
