

Remember a battery tender is not the same as a charger. A charger is for charging and will destroy a battery if left on it for the winter. If you don't have a tender. Charge your battery for a few hours each month until Spring.

Strategy

Myths and Bad Habits

yths are woven into the fabric of everything we do, including motorcycling. Going hand in hand with myths are bad habits. Some bad habits are a result of myths and others are a result of complacency. Let's review a couple of myths and bad habits, then finish up with sound riding practices that can enhance confidence levels.

MYTH: MOTORCYCLE SAFETY

Whoever felt compelled to pair the words motorcycle and safety simply created an oxymoron. There is nothing "safe" about piloting a vehicle that requires ample traction, balance and coordination, combined with rapid acceleration and zero passenger restraint or protection. According to Joe Elliott, chief scientist at National Motorcycle Institute (NMI), motorcyclists are 38 times more likely to be killed in a crash than car occupants. Most logical people would agree that motorcycles and safety are unrelated. For more on NMI visit motorcycleinstitute.org

MYTH: LAY IT DOWN

It is necessary to practice correct riding techniques repeatedly, until we are comfortable and capable. Nobody would tell riders to "practice laying it down" to avoid crashing. More specifically, laying it down is a crash! Never use this lame excuse as an attempt to divert blame for crashing.

Practically speaking, once you fall off a motorcycle, you have relinquished all control and have zero input as to where you and the motorcycle will end up.

Other road users will have two things to avoid instead of one. Your body may stop very quickly, as it bounces and grinds along the pavement or impacts other objects, but a motorcycle may take as much as double the distance to stop when sliding.

The good news is that if you are behind the motorcycle you don't need to worry about it hitting you, but if you land in front of it, you've turned the bike into a weapon against yourself.

BAD HABIT: LOOKING DOWN

If you tend to dive toward the inside of a corner, then make numerous segmented turns to complete what should be one smooth and constant radius arc, your issue is visual control. This is often brought on by looking down at road markings while cornering.

Instead, lift your head and eyes up off the ground and focus aggressively on the exit of the corner. It is amazing how more comfortable and confident we become when we look exactly where we want to go, rather than where we don't.

BAD HABIT: UNDERUTILIZING THE FRONT BRAKE

To paraphrase the Hurt Report (1981), braking before crashes is often characterized by overuse of the rear brake and underuse of the front brake. It is amazing how much brake force a motorcycle can muster, when we use proper technique.

Reach and squeeze is only the beginning, but it requires a continued focused effort to stop more quickly. If you haven't practiced quick stops from freeway speeds, start by practicing more aggressive braking at lower speeds and carefully working up to higher speeds, until you are comfortable stopping quickly from any speed. Braking physics are vastly different at freeway speed than at parking lot speed. Practice until you are proficient making 1 G stops.

Motorcycling is unforgiving. We must always be at the top of our game. It may not be possible to ride safely, but it is always possible to ride better.

Stopping distance increases at the square of velocity; Doubling speed quadruples physical braking distance. Additionally, the distance we travel during the reaction time between identifying a need to brake and physically applying the brakes also increases greatly with speed:
