#### **Notes from Bill**

Well we are thru March and have our bill moving. We are half way thru the session with the end in sight. We have to keep up the pressure to keep things moving. HB 523, the helmet bill is hopefully coming out of the house and then will be moving over to the senate. Everyone will need to be in touch with their senators to get it thru. We have a couple that might not want us to get it thru there so keep the emails and phone calls going .HB 302 AND SB 267 are the failure to yield bills that are filed by Rep Ron Hicks And Senator Kurt Schaefer, we have had hearings on these bills on March 4 and hopefully we get these out of committee and on the floor soon to get them moving there should not be much opposition on these bills. We did get this bill, thru the house and the senate last year but we had to go back to the senate and ran out of time. With a little luck we will be able to get this moving and get to the governor's desk. We also have HB553 the motorcycle licenses plate bill this would allow the plate to be mounted vertical. It has been do pass thru the select committee and now waiting to be put on the calendar. Hopefully we got this on the calendar by the time you have read this, HB555 has had a hearing but at this time has not been voted out of the committee we will be keepingan eye on this bill. HB 650 the led lights bill, it put wording in the statue about these lights and opens it up to all colors. It has was voted out do pass consent thru the transportation committee and is in the select committee on rules. It was not on the calendar but hopefully they will get to it soon and keep it moving. HB 562 has t d with the autocycle. Allows certain three wheel vehicles to not have to wear a helmet. This bill is on the house calendar for consent, and should be oved on soon. SB 135, this is the helmet bill in the senate. They will be hearing it in the transportation committee March 4 and hopefully get it out soon after. We also have SB 544 just filed by Sen. Schaefer this is an act defines motorcycle pro filing and creates regulations to eliminate motorcycling profiling. We will have to see what committee this one gets in to and start talking to them and get a hearing as soon as possible. We also have HB 1025 that would allow out of state riders that do not require helmets in there state to ride in MO without a helmet during the month of August. It has not been put in a committee right now but will keep looking at it. There is a lot of other bills that I have been watching but none are doing anything right now. I send an email update at the end of the week to keep you informed. If you are not getting these emails please get your email address to Dallas so she can put you on the list, or contact one of your officers in your local to keep you up to date.

The My Rally is May 5, we will be meeting at Memorial Park in Jefferson City MO and will be having a parade to the capitol. There will be speakers at this event and then we will be going up to visit with your senators and representatives. This is the second to last week of session so we may need to push them a little to finish a few of our bills. There will be coffee and donuts at the start.

Spring is here and hope the weather is cooperating for riding. Will be getting out there and doing a little riding myself soon so hope to see you out there. I'm sure there will be lots of events to go to, be safe.

Safety tip of the month: I'm sure everyone reading this is aware that the front brake does most of the work stopping the bike, particularly in a hard stop. A figure often quoted for this is 70%' front brake, 30% rear, but this is only an approximate rule. This figure can vary from motorcycle to motorcycle, bikes with shorter wheelbases and higher centers of gravity get more stopping power from the front brake. Cruiser bikes come closer to the standard 70/30 rule. Touring bikes can vary according to load. If you have an occasion to ride an unfamiliar bike, take it out on a deserted parking lot or stretch of road and see how it stops before you get into heavy traffic situations.




Yes this I heard as a kid and thought it applied to FORR today.

# AMA supports bill to protect riders from unsafe fuel

Contact your senators today!

In an effort to prohibit the proliferation of E15, a gasoline formulation that contains up to 15 percent ethanol by volume, the American Motorcyclist Association supports U.S. Sens. Pat Toomey (R-Pa.), Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) and Jeff Flake's (R-Ariz.) S. 577, the Corn Ethanol Mandate Elimination Act of 2015. The bipartisan bill would eliminate the corn ethanol mandate in the Renewable Fuel Standard.

The AMA has repeatedly alerted government officials and federal lawmakers to the possible damage to motorcycle and all-terrain vehicle fuel systems and engines from the inadvertent use of E15 when the fuel becomes widely available.

Passing S. 577 will protect the 22 million motorcycles and all-terrain vehicles currently in use on America's roads and trails from inadvertent misfueling. Riders depend on the safe operation of these vehicles.

Preventing inadvertent misfuelings remains one of the AMA's top priorities because motorcycles and ATVs in use today are not designed to run on ethanol blends higher than 10 percent, and many older machines favored by vintage enthusiasts have problems with any ethanol in the fuel. Often, simply using fuel with blends of ethanol higher than 10 percent can void a manufacturer's warranty, potentially leaving riders stranded by the road or trail with thousands of dollars in repair costs.

We need your help to pass S. 577. You can send a prewritten email to your senators immediately by following the "Take Action" option and entering your information. The AMA encourages riders to personalize their messages by drawing on their own riding experiences.

# Fee-Free Days On Public Lands Visit Public Lands For Free

The U.S. Department of the Interior has announced the list of days when the public can access the nation's land without paying fees. The American Motorcyclist Association urges you to take advantage of these fee-free days to explore the nation's public lands.

The days on which there will be no fees are:

- April 18-19 Opening Weekend of National Park Week, fee free at National Park Service properties
- June 13 —National Get Outdoors Day, a fee-free day through the U.S Forest Service
- Aug. 25 National Park Service Birthday, fee free at National Park Service properties
- Sept. 26 For National Public Lands Day, fees will be waived at lands managed by the National Park Service, Fish & Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service
- Oct. 11 In honor or National Wildlife Refuge Week, all amenity fees will be waived at properties managed by the Fish & Wildlife Service
- Nov. 11 In honor of our nation's veterans the DOI will waive amenity fees on all of America's public lands

#### Bills may put motorcyclists at risk

On Feb. 10, U.S. Sens. Marco Rubio (R-Fla.) and Cory Booker (D-N.J.) introduced S. 424, the Wi-Fi Innovation Act . The bill would require the Federal Communications Commission to open the reserved spectrum to unlicensed devices in the upper 5.8 GHz and lower 5.9 GHz band, eliminating the FCC and the U.S. Department of Transportation's ability to ensure the vehicle-to-vehicle technology is free from interference.

Companion legislation (H.R. 821) has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by U.S. Reps. Bob Latta (R-Ohio), Darrell Issa (R-Calif.), Anna Eshoo (D-Calif.), Doris Matsui (D-Calif.) and Suzan DelBene (D-Wash.).

The American Motorcyclist Association opposes these bills and shares the Intelligent Transportation Society of America's position that the testing plan for the use of unlicensed devices in the 5.8 GHz to 5.9 GHz band "should proceed without pre-emptive legislation that sets arbitrary deadlines and restrictive parameters."

Tell Congress you oppose these bills. Send a prewritten email by using the easy-to-use AMA Federal Action Center.

The AMA is concerned that over-reliance on technological driving solutions could increase the risk to motorcyclists by lulling motorists into a false sense of security and by reducing their overall awareness of their surroundings while behind the wheel.

Before allowing unlicensed devices to operate within the band, the DOT needs to test them, free from political pressure and artificial deadlines, to ensure that motorcyclists' safety and privacy are secure and that vehicles using advanced crash-avoidance and vehicle-to-vehicle technologies are not compromised.

To date, the DOT has been unable to guarantee there would be no interference.

Intersections already pose a well-documented problem for motorcyclists. Imagine how much more dangerous intersections would become if drivers begin to rely on advanced safety technologies that are not thoroughly tested? Drivers may believe these technologies will protect them and other road users, and may not be prepared for malfunction at a critical juncture.

In testimony before the House Science, Space and Technology Committee in the last Congress, U.S. Department of Transportation Assistant Secretary for Research and Technology Gregory D. Winfree said, "We have very serious concerns about any spectrum sharing that prevents or delays access to the desired channel or otherwise preempts the safety applications. At this time, the department is unaware of any existing or proposed technical solution which guarantees interferencefree operation of the DSRC safety-critical applications, while allowing Wi-Fi enabled devices to share the 5.9 GHz spectrum" (emphasis added). The DOT believes these technologies will reduce the 6 million crashes and more than 30,000 fatalities that occur annually on U.S. roadways. According to a National Telecommunications and Information Administration report, connected-vehicle technology "will enhance safety on the nation's highways," potentially addressing "80 percent of the crash scenarios involving non-impaired drivers." The report also cites National Highway Traffic Safety Administration research showing that connectedvehicle technology "could help prevent the majority of types of crashes that typically occur in the real world, such as crashes at intersections or while changing lanes."

In a landmark study published in 1981, the Motorcycle Accident Cause Factors and Identification of Countermeasures Volume I: Technical Report (popularly known as the "Hurt Report"), the single most common multi-vehicle motorcycle crash involves a car making a left turn into the path of a motorcycle at an intersection. Additionally, in a "Motorcycle Accidents In-Depth Study," researchers investigated in detail 921 crashes in 1999 and 2000 in France, Germany, the Netherlands, Spain and Italy and found that 54.3 percent of the crashes occurred at intersections.

Help ensure that future high-technology solutions for our roadways make the riding environment safer for motorcyclists. Tell Congress you oppose these bills!

#### **New Mexico Accomplishments**

March 9, 2015

A recent release went out about the great work being done by the motorcyclists in New Mexico to defeat two helmet law attempts. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation would like to apologize for failing to give credit to multiple organizations in New

Mexico. The organizations who did the work, and do deserve the credit are, New Mexico Motorcycle Rights Organization, Coalition of Clubs, US Defenders, National Coalition of Motorcyclists, and many independent riders.

S.B. 327 would have simply mandated helmets for all motorcycle operators and passengers. Current law states that motorcyclists seventeen and under must wear a helmet. The second bill, S.B. 308, would have allowed both operator and passenger to ride helmet-less after purchasing a \$697 license plate sticker to offset the burden that some believe comes with helmet-less riding. Both bills were killed in the New Mexico Senate Public Affairs Committee by a vote of 4-3.

Congratulations to the freedom fighting motorcyclists of New Mexico for the hard work and dedication to defeat these two bills.

# New Mexico and South Dakota 2015 Legislative Accomplishments

February 4, 2015

South Dakota passed S.B. 85 to remove the restrictions on handle bar heights for motorcycles. Current law dictates that handle bar height must be at or below shoulder height. The new law removes the restriction, and as ABATE of South Dakota State Coordinator Jiggs Creasy put it, "There actually is still one restriction, interstate overpasses." The MRF salutes the fine work done by ABATE of South Dakota. Sturgis attendees will no longer be harassed by the police for handlebars. South Dakota joins thirteen other states that have no handlebar height restrictions of any kind.

New Mexico is celebrating the demise of not one, but two helmet law attempts. S.B. 327 would have simply mandated helmets for all motorcycle operators and passengers. Current law states that motorcyclists seventeen and under must wear a helmet. The second bill, S.B. 308, would have allowed both operator and passenger to ride helmet-less after purchasing a \$697 license plate sticker to offset the burden that some believe comes with helmetless riding. Both bills were killed in the New Mexico Senate Public Affairs Committee by a vote of 4-3. ABATE of New Mexico faced some tough opposition with lots of health care professionals and doctors in the committee room. ABATE of New Mexico was ready. They had over 700 motorcyclists at their State Capitol Bike Day and handily defeated the legislation.

Both of these are perfect examples of education, organizing, and executing at the state capitol. The MRF commends both South Dakota and New Mexico for their legislative savvy and professionalism.

Motorcyclists are frequently stopped by police as they travel simply because they ride a motorcycle or are wearing motorcycle riding apparel. Often these pretext stops are accompanied with the explanation that a traffic infraction has occurred, which is not always the case. In some cases people have been told they are violating a law that does not exist. In other cases the violation cited simply has not occurred. Motorcyclists come from all walks of life and most are law abiding citizens. They have their travel interrupted on their way to work, family events, meetings, church and other places. Motorcyclists should not be treated differently from other members of the transportation mix. Please support this legislation that assures chief law enforcement officers, at the state and local level, establish and enforce a written policy governing the conduct of peace officers engaged in stops of motorcycle riding citizens.

#### United States House of Representatives Address Motorcycle Checkpoints

February 13, 2015

Today, February 12th, Congressman James F Sensenbrenner (R-WI) circulated a "dear colleague" letter to inform his fellow members of the House of Representatives that he will be soon introducing legislation to end the federal funding of motorcycle only roadside checkpoints.

Currently the federal government can and has supplied cash to states to conduct mandatory motorcycle only checkpoints. This legislation, which will be known as H.R. 1861, would put an end to that. In the letter Sensenbrenner states, "I will be reintroducing H.R. 1861, the Stop Motorcycle Checkpoint Funding Act, to protect motorcyclists' rights and promote crash prevention as the most effective use of taxpayer money to save motorcyclists' lives."

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF), along with ABATE of Wisconsin met with Sensenbrenner earlier this week to discuss this important matter. The MRF obviously strongly opposes this sort of motorcyclist discrimination. "Pulling law abiding motorcyclists off the road does not make anyone safer is a waste of taxpayer money and is law enforcement harassment at its worst," said Jeff Hennie, Vice President for Government Relations and Public Affairs for the MRF.

The MRF urges you to contact your Representative in Congress and ask them to join in support of this important legislation as an original cosponsor. You can reach the capitol switchboard at 202-224-3121 and you can find the name of your Representative here: http://www.house.gov/representatives/find/. It is important to gather as many cosponsors as possible to ensure passage of H.R. 1861.

The MRF will keep you informed on this matter so you can engage your member of congress on this important matter impacting motorcyclists on a national level.


