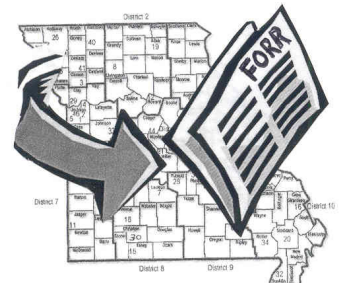

Webmaster – *absent* – Mike has requested we find his replacement. Blue Host our server, sucks and we need to replace. The Social Media Coordinator has been asked but it's probably a no, 2 different animals. We will place an ad in The Freedom Press for a new webmaster.

Awareness Coordinator – **Deanna Rhodes/Heather Dunham** – Deanna and Joe say thanks for coming to the wedding and all the gifts. Keep doing the awareness booths and if you see MODOT Highway signs let her know where. Need help in the awareness tent at Homecoming. Any ideas? MODOT requested to have a booth and we were against it and we found out it was an outside company setting up for them. MMSF has been outsourcing some of the tasks that Missouri Organizations do for free. A recent MODOT article states there was a 40% increase in crashes and 800% increase in deaths w/o helmets. Bad year for motorcycles and what did they base those numbers on since we had no numbers to compare to? We have riders that are not following the law and that may come back to bite us when stats are compiled.

Legislative Coordinator – **Joe Widmer** HB 661 – omnibus bill allowing ground lights of any color instead of just amber or white, changing the autocycle definition to include handlebars not just steering wheel was vetoed due to a provision regarding emissions. We need someone to step up to work with Joe this coming year and learn the position. We need to keep a watchful eye on bills that would reverse the helmet modification. FAST Democracy App on your phone tracks bills and will notify you of changes, etc.

MRF - Amy Allmon – Bad news, Doc D'Errico – MRF State Reps Rep and Director of the Massachusetts Motorcycle Association passed away after several weeks in a coma after a motorcycle accident and "Legs" Korte was a past board member of MRF and ABATE of Illinois has also passed away. They have left big holes in our hearts. Meeting of the Minds will be in Atlanta September 23-26, 2021. If you are interested in attending, get with me since the deadline for hotel reservations and event registration is soon. Remember all politics are local so pay attention to city council, school board and mayoral races. I recently attended a meet and greet for Rick Bratton currently Missouri Senator for District 31 and he is considering a run for US House Rep for District 4 or Vicky Hartzler's seat since she is running for the open US Senate seat left by Roy Blunt's retirement. Also running for that Senate seat is Mark McClosky, Eric Grietens, Eric Schmidt. Looking for Assistant MRF reps in the southern area and St. Louis area so get with me if you are interested. Recruiting MRF members and providing information on Federal legislation. Once FORR determines who we would like to back in the Senate race or any Federal election we can request that the MRF make a donation to the campaign on our behalf.

Mid-South Mile – Roy “Cowboy” Hoard – Next meeting is August 1 in Oklahoma. A presenter needs some information regarding registered motorcycles, accidents, etc. for a Family Feud type of questions. Need auction items to be brought to next CC meeting August 29. Tami is charged with gathering the items for the basket. She is donating a T-bag for the bike and would like items to place in the bag for our donation. Please bring all donated items to the September CC meeting (in August). October 22-24, 2021, it will be held at the MCM Elegante Hotel, Dallas, TX. Mid-South MILE will return to Missouri in 2023.

Riders Education – Beth Clark August class is full and there are 2 spots left in the October class. One 3-wheel class September 17-19 only one person scheduled at this time. Since this is a license waiver class, we could lose money since it will be held anyway. Class participants will receive a 1-year free membership if they sign-up within 30 days of their class. There was some confusion but have determined that I will give them the membership application and inform them that it must be returned within 30 days. And I will hand them out instead of just allowing them to take if wanted. I have a range aid that will not take money, so I have paid for his membership. I have contacted the webmaster to determine if I am able to change or update Rider's Ed information. So, we could possibly relieve him of the burden of updating class information. The National Guard will not be using the hotel classroom next year for classes so it would be available. Marine Corp League fits our needs better but more expensive. Can speak to Dave Hunter so maybe we can work out a deal. There is not a TV, currently using the one from the trailer which is a small and I need to learn to use the PowerPoint on the TV, they may allow us to use the one in the bar. Mike will be placed in next years class. There is also another gentleman interested in becoming an instructor. Spoke with Doug about selling our extra training bikes of which there are about 8. Most are GZs and the State program may be interested in purchasing them for use or parts.

Membership – Kim Lorton I am going to try to visit each local once things calm down after summer. Get to know the people and see faces. Plan was to obtain archive membership lists and contact some of the people we have lost but it was brought to my attention that I might want to speak with the presidents of each local first to verify who they would not wish to invite back. Suggested that if they enjoy their freedom of choice, please show your support/appreciation, and become a member. They also spoke of Federal legislation regarding the profiling bill.

Product Line – Shaulene Capps We have 2 more rally's to attend but not really producing anything new since she did not want to have a large batch of merchandise for the organization to buy back. Freedom Press – Michelle “Rebel” O'Connor July issue had ink smears on pages 4 and 21. Tried to get credit and they refused to work out the issue. Local 11 made the motion to send out a notice to every member that we are going digital and if you wish to continue to receive a printed copy they return the notification, 2nd by Local 10. Motion was not passed unanimous voice vote. Motion from Local 11 to print on the front of the Freedom Press, 2nd by Local 3. Motion passed with 1 no vote.

Social Media Coordinator – Our posts reached 16,000 in May on Facebook, and nearly 9,000 in June. Instagram and MeWe are running about the same as previous report. Email smc@forn.net or message me on Facebook.

FEW Seminar – Jammie Tipton via Joe. This is my weekend to work sorry I couldn't be there. I have come up with a theme: you must have a heart, a brain and courage to ride. Joe calls dibs on the Lion costume. I am content to be a passenger because she is to chicken poop to ride. She has patches and pamphlets coming from BADD and Joe doesn't know if it's Biker's Against Drunk Drivers or Biker's Against Dumb Drivers. We need 2 baskets from each local using the theme of your choosing, one for live auction and one for silent auction. Don't forget the opening ceremony with color guard. Encourage attendance especially new members and stress minimal drinking until the conclusion of the seminar. Guest speakers, dinner menu, Incentive Drawing.

Homecoming – Joe “DC” Karr Last year we had 58 total sponsors, about \$6,100 and bike ticket sales for a total of about \$25,000. Currently we have 41 sponsors for \$4,750 I would like to see 60 sponsors and \$7,500. We still have room for t-shirt and trophy sponsors. Go back to your local and encourage sponsorship. We have bike tickets for sale up until time of drawing. L-15 bike show tent, L-2 setting up that big tent. Potties are paid for 20 with 2 handwashing stations. This year we have a 12x18 banner on Highway 7 next to the Creighton exit. Our budget was \$500 and we came in under at about

\$488 it is reusable. Still need golf carts with headlights, Donna Hilburn security chief, we have purchased new radios. Trophies by Mark & Shaulene. Friday music by Dirty Saints, Saturday Love Bomb. Thursday, August 19, 2pm, early bird access, vendors and RVs can set up. VFW beer garden will be set up for karaoke at 5pm. Friday, August 20, 4pm gates open, 4:30pm opening ceremony, 5pm Cornhole tournament sponsored by Montrose VFW. At 7pm Friday Frozen t-shirt contest. There will be a bucket at front gate for donations for prize money for Frozen and Wet T-shirt winners, 8pm-midnight Dirty Saints. Saturday, August 21, 8am gates open, noon Bike Show, 1st & 2nd place, Best in Show, & Peoples Choice. 10 classes, 1pm judging begins and winners announced 1:45pm, 2pm Bike Games, 4pm Human Games Battle of the Locals, 6:30 Wet T-shirt/Ms. Homecoming, 8pm-1am Love Bomb. Sunday, August 22, 9am closing ceremony and church services. Still need folks to work shifts, there will be tags for vehicles allowed to move about the grounds as needed. Security will have t-shirts, first aide booth, awareness booth. Individuals cannot bring personal golf carts unless handicap placard is displayed. We have 20, 5-gallon buckets to play bucket pong at your leisure. All RV spots are filled, you can pay \$25 and use your generator. Emily Cox has an RV spot she can't use and would like to "sell". To rent an RV call Blue Bird Outdoor Adventures (660) 553-8937. 2 food vendors and 2 merchandise vendors with checks received. T-shirt and trophy sponsor cutoff is July 31. Banner sponsors must provide their own banner. Security staging will be near first aid and awareness. Gate booth can get there about 6-7pm Wednesday. Additional expense of 200 feet of orange fencing and metal fence post. Sell tickets for wet t-shirt hose man. You must remain mostly sober to be allowed to sign out and drive a golf cart.

Old Business – Floating the idea of reimbursing a member for classes in web design and sign a contract to remain in the position for specific time frame. Bank change has not been forgotten but logistically it is going to be difficult and contains Missouri Ethics Commission considerations. Please remember that all of us have family and jobs and can't drop everything to take care of your issue right that minute. Be patient.

Motion from Local 7 to sponsor All Bike Drag Races in Rogersville, Arkansas Ozark Dragway for \$100, 2nd by Local 1 passed with unanimous voice vote.

New Business – Using the Giveaway fund and earmarking it for Meeting of the Minds. Local 1 move that we change the Giveaway fund to Meeting of the Minds fund and 2nd by Local 6. Holding funds in this account for the MOTM and then afterwards we can convert back to Giveaway fund and it can be used in the interim to fund a Giveaway for MOTM. Roll Call vote 26 yes votes and 6 absent. Motion passed. Local 11 made the motion and 2nd by Local 3 that we do incentive drawing donations at State level and the proceeds will be deposited into MOTM. Passed unanimous voice vote.

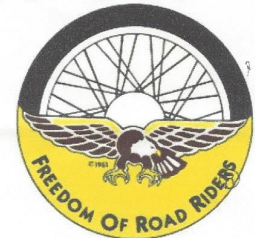
Hey Guys,

Legislation ensures motorcyclists have a voice on infrastructure issues



The Motorcyclist Advisory Council Reauthorization Act, H.R. 2141 and S. 1853, is bipartisan legislation introduced in the House of Representatives by Reps. Mike Gallagher (R-Wisc.), Jared Huffman (D-Calif.), Gwen Moore (D-Wisc.), Don Young (R-Alaska), Julia Brownley (D-Calif.), Troy Balderson (R-Ohio), and Chris Pappas (D-N.H.) and in the Senate by Sens. Gary Peters (D-Mich.), Joni Ernst (R-Iowa), Tammy Baldwin (D-Ill.), and Angus King (I-Maine) will reauthorize the Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) for six years and expand membership on the council to include more motorcyclist voices and transportation officials.

The MAC serves as the only official forum for the motorcycling community to have an open dialogue with the U.S. Department of Transportation to discuss concerns about infrastructure design, issues with intelligent transportation systems, and other areas of safety affecting motorcyclists on the road.

The last iteration of the MAC was co-chaired by AMA Director of Government Relations Michael Sayre, and was disbanded after their formal recommendations were submitted to the Federal Highway Administration in early 2020. You can read those recommendations here.

H.R. 2141 and S. 1853 takes the lessons learned from the last iteration of the MAC and will create a more effective and diverse council that will issue three rounds of recommendations over six years.

Take action now: Let's ensure the U.S. DOT continues to hear from the motorcycling community!

Proposed Transportation Bill Amendment Fails



Late Monday night, three Congressional champions for motorcyclists' rights asked Congress to add language to a massive spending bill that would help protect motorcyclists from profiling by law enforcement. The amendment to a Department of Transportation funding bill would have prohibited federal funds being used to "Encourage States to adopt legislation, regulations, policies, directives or guidance to profile motorcycle riders, nor shall such funds be used by States to implement any activity with the primary intent of profiling motorcycle riders."

The amendment failed, as the House Parliamentarian ruled it "not in order," citing a prohibition on policies proposals like this being attached to funding bills. Of the nearly 700 amendments submitted, almost 400 other amendments were handed the same fate.

Frustratingly, the Rules Committee members were not even allowed to vote on these provisions.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) is disappointed that a commonsense concept like the one offered today was blocked by an unelected bureaucrat. Nevertheless, we will remain vigilant in our fight against the profiling of bikers. We thank Representative Tim Walberg (Michigan), Representative Michael Burgess (Texas) and Representative Troy Balderson (Ohio) for drafting the amendment and seeking ways to combat the profiling of bikers in the country.

Additionally, the MRF would like to thank the other members of the House Rules Committee who expressed support for the amendment including Rep. Cole (Oklahoma), Rep. Reschenthaler (Pennsylvania) and Rep. Fischbach (Minnesota).

All bikers should thank their fellow riders from Colorado, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, and Texas who lobbied members of the committee to pass this amendment. Rest assured that the MRF will continue to fight in the halls of Congress until lawmakers act on this important issue.

Another important part of our job as State Reps is to sign up new members for the MRF. We believe that only by keeping our SMROs and the MRF strong can we continue to fight and win on behalf of all riders.

Except for a small administrative staff and our full-time lobbyist in Washington, D.C., all the other people involved with the MRF are volunteers. None of us, including the MRF Officers and members of the Board of Directors, are paid. We do what we do because we believe in the MRF and our mission.

Here are but a few of the MRF's many achievements:

- Stopped federal legislation that would have classified any group of three or more riders wearing similar clothing as a 'gang'.
- Stopped governmental agencies from using taxpayer dollars to lobby against motorcycling.
- Stopped unfair EPA regulations that would have forced riders to use only 'Approved OEM' parts on their bikes.
- Supporting voluntary rider education efforts to decrease motorcycle accidents and helping rider education programs to obtain government grants.
- Led the effort to repeal federal blackmail laws trying to force states to pass mandatory helmet laws for all riders.
- Continuing to ensure that motorcycles are accounted for in autonomous (self-driving) vehicle designs.
- Stopped unfair insurance provisions targeting motorcyclists.

- Working to stop motorcycle profiling and bogus check points by law enforcement agencies.
- Overturned the 'superbike' ban attempting to stop the sale of high-performing motorcycles.

Throughout its history, the MRF has trained many thousands of biker's rights activists through its annual **Meeting of The Minds** conference. MRF also organizes the yearly **'Bikers Inside the Beltway'** grassroots lobbying event – where riders from all over the country go to Washington, D.C. to help fight for their rights.

For more than 30 years, the MRF has led a network of strong motorcyclists' rights organizations protecting rider's rights. The MRF has made sure that we can ride the kind of bikes we want to ride, with the people we want to ride with, wearing what we want to wear, on the roads we want to ride, and make the changes to our bikes that we want to make.

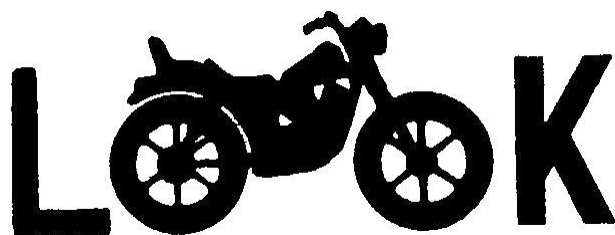

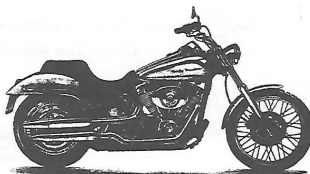
