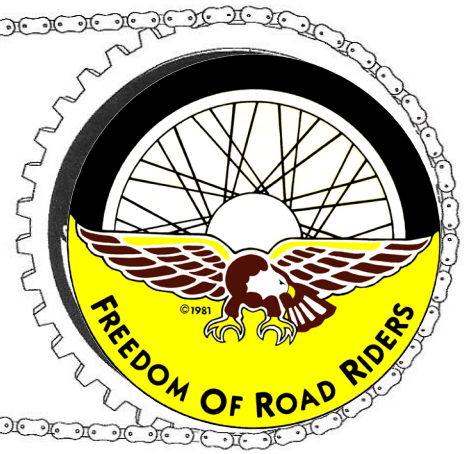

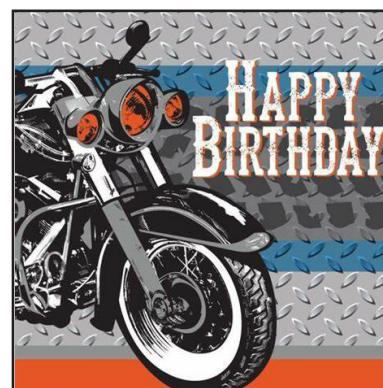

I know there is something that I have forgotten to write, but I forgot! This has been one of the most difficult issues I have had in years.... Nuff said!

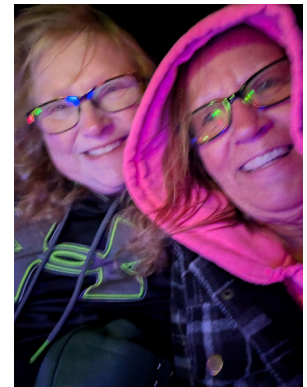

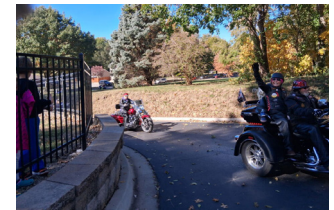
On October 19th, we had our monthly meeting where 20 members were present. Our next meetings will be on November 16th and December 21st.

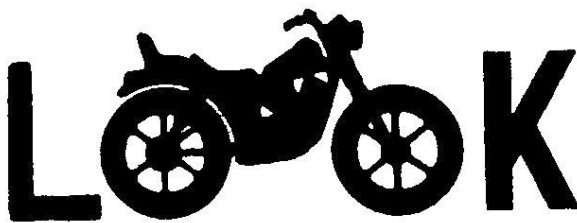
