# Mid-South M.I.L.E.

The Mid-South M.I.L.E. was first conceived in the winter of 1992 when over 100 dedicated individuals from the four state area (Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri and Oklahoma) met in Joplin, MO at a small community center. The goal was to share ideas, techniques, strategies and enthusiasm with other motorcycle rights activists and freedom fighters; that goal was certainly accomplished

A seminar was proposed as an opportunity for motorcyclists rights group members to meet and benefit from each other's experiences and to begin working together toward a common goal; the preservation of our freedom as motorcyclists. The time had come to unite as brothers and sisters or perish as fools.

The first Mid-South M.I.L.E. was planned and organized by a small committee of 4 dedicated freedom fighters; Duncan and Candy Campbell and Willy and Lilly Garrigan were the first committee of the Mid-South M.I.L.E. It was decided that the location of the Mid-South M.I.L.E. would rotate between the states to give each of us a chance to host the other states and show them just how we could entertain and enlighten. It was clear from the beginning meetings that the Mid-South M.I.L.E. had the potential to accomplish these goals.

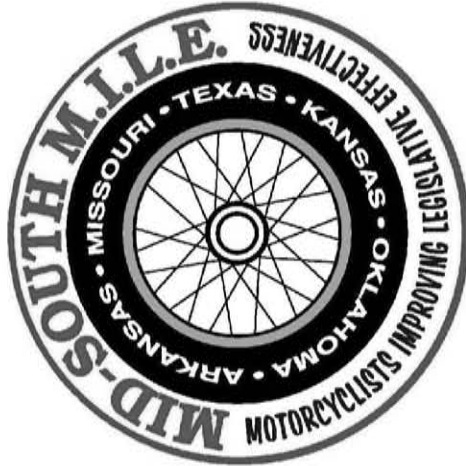

Dear editor:

After one and a half years stewing over this information, I thought I would go ahead and bring it to your attention. I know this organization of ours is many years old now, and is suffering at all levels (membership, attendance, leaders, etc. etc.) and do in part to our self agendas. I have only met one of the original members who built this organization, but from what I saw in him I do not believe that he or the others ever intended for us to get so large that we can not self govern ourselves. If at some point we just can't shut our mouths and get along with one another, we are doomed for extinction as an organization. OK, enough of my opinion, here is the information I have stewed over the last year and a half. A little over a year and a half ago at the January 2014 District 4 meeting, the two new incoming District 4 Chairmen, (Amy Local 5 and Rebecca Local 5) asked that each one of the Local Reps take back to their Locals some information about Octoberfest. They were asked to discuss this move with their Local and bring back what each Local wanted to do. The idea was to move away from the Sand Drag Strip in Grain Valley, MO. and move back out to the country (south of 50 hi-way 1/8 mile), to a location just south of Flo & Ed's house/ property. It was explained to the Local Reps. that District 4 could save a substantial amount of money on the move, for 2013 District 4 paid the Sand Drag Strip \$1157.00 dollars & in 2014 District 4 paid \$787.00. The cost would have been \$1037.00 for 2014, expect the owner of the Sand Drag Track felt bad that the racers could not use the Drag strip because of two much rain before the event. District 4 contract agreement with the Sand Drag Track is so much money per head in the gate, and then \$500.00 to use the Sand Drag Track. District 4 could be paying for the new site, in the neighbor hood of \$400.00 to \$500.00 depending on gate head count which would be more like the old days. The majority of the Reps sitting in that Dist. 4 meeting went off the deep end, and handed Amy & Rebecca there heads on a silver platter and made the decision right then and there for there not to move Octoberfest from the Sand Drag Strip in Grain Valley. Kathy and I have since last October bumped into 2 District 4 Local presidents that had never even heard that we could possibly move back to the country on a grass 20 acre field with half of it partial wooded for shade and camp fires, and save a lot of money. Amy has since told me she brought the idea up again, about moving Octoberfest this last January 2015 at the District 4 meeting, and was once again handed her head to her on a silver platter. So District 4 Presidents and their Locals, I know we (each Local) elects people to hold positions for us to help operate or run our Locals, but if a single person can or does make a decision on behalf of their Local, what is the use of having a local made up of Officers? 

### Summertime Slowdown

With the House having recessed for the month of August and the Senate sticking around to debate the issue de jour – defunding Planned Parenthood – Congress was only operating at half speed this week. For the most part, this week was spent greasing the wheels for the fall when the House takes up the Highway bill. It is unclear what the House will do at this point. One outcome (and the most unlikely of all) is that the House simply takes up the Senate bill and passes as is. A more realistic outcome is that the House will hem and haw until the deadline puts some real pressure on them to pass a bill. Current funding now expires October 29th, and I would venture to guess that we most likely see the water began to boil on this bill sometime around the beginning of October. The different transportation coalitions with which the Motorcycle Riders Foundation work are circling the wagons and getting on the same page to force the House to act once and for all.

### Recess in DC

It's Recess, the most wonderful time of the year in Washington DC! All of your elected officials are back in their home districts to campaign and hold town hall meetings. I don't want to tell you how to spend your summer, but you should take a few hours of it and go to a town hall meeting, especially with your Representatives. Tell them to get to work on passing a highway bill – they need to be reminded, badly. You can find out their schedules from their websites or by simply calling a home district office.

Stop the decade of E15 misinformation:  
Urge your representative to protect your access to safe fuel



The first 10 years under the Renewable Fuel Standard, established in 2005, represent a decade of misinformation from the ethanol lobby concerning safe fuel for your motorcycle.

To protect your access to safe fuel, urge your representative to cosponsor the RFS Reform Act of 2015 (H.R. 704). The American Motorcyclist Association needs your help to pass this bill. You can send a prewritten email to your representative immediately by following the "Take Action" option and entering your information. The AMA encourages riders to personalize their message by drawing on their own personal riding experiences.

In an effort to prohibit the spread of E15 fuel, which contains up to 15 percent ethanol by volume, the AMA supports H.R. 704, sponsored by U.S. Reps. Bob Goodlatte (R-Va.) and Peter Welch's (D-Vt.). The bipartisan bill would amend the Renewable Fuel Standard to recognize market conditions and realities. It also would prohibit the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency from allowing any station to sell gasoline containing more than 10 percent ethanol by volume and require those already selling it to stop.

In other words, the sale of E15 will not be permitted if this legislation becomes law.

The AMA has repeatedly expressed concerns to government officials and federal lawmakers about possible damage to motorcycle and all-terrain-vehicle fuel systems and engines from the inadvertent use of E15. Allowing the higher ethanol blends to become more readily available greatly increases the chance of misfueling.

In October 2010, the EPA approved E15 for use in model year 2007 and newer light duty vehicles (cars, light-duty trucks, and medium-duty passenger vehicles). In January 2011, it added model year 2001-2006 light duty vehicles to the approved list.

Passing H.R. 704 will help protect the estimated 22 million motorcycles and all-terrain vehicles currently in use on America's roads and trails that are not approved to use E15, and the riders who depend on safe fuel for their operation.

Preventing inadvertent misfuelings has been one of the AMA's top priorities, because motorcycles and ATVs are not designed to run on ethanol blends higher than 10 percent, and many older machines favored by vintage enthusiasts have problems with any ethanol at all in the fuel. Using fuel with more than 10 percent ethanol can void the manufacturer's warranty, potentially leaving motorcyclists with thousands of dollars in additional maintenance costs.
