What is RIGHT with Freedom of Road

Riders

There have been several posts on here this afternoon about an issue that came up at a state FORR meeting earlier today. I want everyone to be crystal clear about one thing: I know ABSOLUTELY nothing about this, about what happened, or how it will be resolved. But I do know something about FORR. I'm one of the greybeards (not figuratively but I like the label) or a lifer as some of us jokingly refer to ourselves. I joined in May, 1981, member #62 in a very small organization that had taken on a task that other organizations had not been able to accomplish. Many of those very early members were in the other aforementioned organizations. They saw what went right and wrong, they learned from those lessons and, to their credit, they did not burn out and give up on what they believed in. They put the knowledge they gained from those other organizations to work in the new one. And, as the Chinese are fond of saying, they took the first step on a journey of a thousand miles. Yes, they also made a lot of mistakes along the way. They learned from them also. People sometimes think I was there at the start but I wasn't. Just as this nation had founding fathers, so did we. Our Washingtons, Jeffersons, and Ben Franklins were Mike "Animal" McPeek, John Wonderly, and Dennis Bitner. They broke the ground and laid the foundation for everything that followed. Small victories at first but critical ones for everything that followed. 1981- First sponsored helmet law repeal bill introduced in the MO legislature. 1982- First committee hearing on a helmet law repeal bill. 1983- First House vote on a helmet law repeal bill. We lost and published a special edition of the newsletter to let every single member know how their rep voted. More building blocks. Also in 1983 we sent our first three candidates to MSF rider education instructor training. They all passed and began working in the KC area under the auspices of the MO Motorcycle Safety Program. An involvement in a critical part of motorcycle safety and an important alliance formed that would benefit us for over a decade. 1984- We began an aggressive program to expand the organization so it could truly be called statewide. In a few year's time FORR had locals in every corner of this state and across all the areas in between. And we continued to fight for motorcyclist's rights and monitored legislation, promoting that which was favorable to all riders. And we established safety coordinator as a new cabinet level post. And state meetings went from quarterly to bi-monthly, to give the membership more timely responses to the issues that affected us all. 1985- We were invited to help host the first Meeting of the Minds in St. Louis, at the airport. The Motorcycle Rider's Foundation was created during that weekend. 1987- We started the Freedom of Road Riders Motorcycle Safety Program, to both train riders and make the public more aware of motorcyclists on all of our roads. More instructors were trained, and new FORR training sites were created. 1988- We continued to work for freedom of choice in this state and established the most successful and important rider training site in this state, right in the shadow of the state's capitol. We trained a class of 9 Cole County sheriff's deputies in one of our most important classes ever. It gave us untold credibility. 1989- We were asked to help present the motorcycle safety seminar at the MOTM in Indianapolis. We created a book on how to start a rider education proram through a state MRO that still serves as a blueprint for organizations today. We introduced our new ride straight poster, which was wildly successful. And we won our first national safety award from the MRF. 1990-We continued to promote motorcycle issues in the legislature and expanded our safety $program further. And we got the MO\,Motorcycle\,Safety\,Program\,to\,train\,our\,first\,chief\,instructor.$ 1991- We trained 297 riders in the first and only self-funded MRO rider education program. There are still those to this day that say that can't be done. It can't if you don't have the right people and the right organization. Through the rest of the 1990s, we continued to fight for the rights of motorcyclists everywhere in this state. In 1999 we did what so many had said was impossible. We got a freedom of choice helmet bill passed through both houses of the MO legislature. And in a cruel twist of fate, we were stabbed in the back by the governor that vetoed it. That happened one more time in the 2000s. Our Safety Program has won five more national awards from both the MRF and the Motorcycle Safety Foundation. We have sponsored many wonderful events for bikers all over the state. We have raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for charities through our toy runs and charity benefits for cancer victims, lupus patients, blood drives, events for abused children, and for those less fortunate than us. Thousands of new riders have been introduced to the wonderful world of motorcycling through our classes. And thousands of experienced riders have learned new skills to ride safely on our street and highways. Afew years ago some legislator got the crazy idea that we needed motorcycle only checkpoints for "safety" instructions. It was nothing but out and out discrimination and an excuse for harassment. We beat that bill in one of the most important victories for both us and every person riding a motorcycle in the state of MO. Some states, like Georgia, weren't so lucky. Have we stumbled along the way? Made mistakes, screwed up, squabbled needlessly, did silly things that ended friendships and relationships? Of course we have. It's what happens when an organization is made up of human beings. We've weathered many storms, lost battles, had unfortunate setbacks, did all kinds of things we wished we could undo. But we PERSEVERED. There is much work still to be done. We still want our freedom of choice in regards to helmets, We still want to make this state a safer one for ALL motorcyclists. And we still want to train our children and all the young people we can about the things we love so much. And how do we do that? The answer is in the fourth word of the preceding sentence,. WE do it, The same way Americans have always done it. I know nothing about what is going on right now at the state level. But I do know something about Freedom of Road Riders. And I am very proud to have been part of it. God bless you all and may you always......be free, Smokey Strodtman





Proposal Introduced Concerning Motorcycle Profiling

WASHINGTON, DC– Representatives Reid Ribble (R-Wisc.) and Tim Walberg (R-Mich.) jointly introduced a resolution concerning the profiling of motorcyclists. H.Res.831, formally titled, "Promoting awareness of motorcycle profiling and encourage collaboration and communication with the motorcycle

community and law enforcement officials to prevent instances of profiling" was introduced and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

The bill defines the practice of motorcycle profiling and cites states which have addressed the issue at the local level. As with all simple resolutions, it expresses the sentiments of a chamber on a particular issue. In the case of H.Res.831, it also promotes increased public awareness on the issue and encourages collaboration, education and training for the motorcycle and law enforcement communities in order to end instances of profiling. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation, who have been advocating for a national solution to address concerns over profiling, will work over the coming months with states' motorcyclists' rights organizations as well as motorcycle clubs and individual riders to advance the measure. Driverless Car Manufacturers Await Guidance from Agency, Motorcyclists Raise Concerns, Questions

WASHINGTON, DC – Over the last several months, we've seen more and more companies announce plans to pursue the creation and manufacture of self-driving cars. Tesla has already been successful, announcing their intention to have an autonomous vehicle ready by 2018 for consumer purchase. Google's prototype currently has a fleet of 58 self-driving vehicles being tested on public streets in California, Washington, Texas and Arizona. GM, Daimler, Volvo, Ford, Jaguar Land Rover, Audi and BMW have also announced plans to pursue the technology. As with most new technologies, the federal government has to play catch-up to this evolving area as it relates to rules and regulations.

This was made apparent when last month, a Tesla Model S on auto-pilot caused a fatal crash in Florida. Though the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) opened an investigation on the incident, NHTSA Administrator Mark Rosekind indicated that the recent controversy around the crash would not deter the agency from embracing self-driving cars as part of the future of safety on the nation's roads. However, the question remains as to what criteria must be established to ensure that driverless cars are safe for consumers. The Department of Transportation (DoT) has indicated that this guidance is likely to be issued sometime this summer. DoT Secretary Anthony Foxx has stated that this will come in the form of federal government guidelines for self-driving vehicles. Critics concerned over the technology have reacted negatively to this announcement, stating that guidelines are only voluntary and that enforceable standards must be established.

For some motorcyclists, there is the hope that a rise in driverless cars could eliminate many of those crashes caused by human error in car versus motorcycle accidents. However, others have expressed concerns over whether motorcyclists on the road can be accounted for by the autonomous technology, given their smaller dimensions. At a recent DoT symposium, staff from the Motorcycle Riders Foundation raised the question to the agency. The spokesperson indicated that motorcycles would absolutely need to be accounted for when developing requirements for self-driving vehicles, given their smaller size on the road. Other motorcyclists fear a far-worst case scenario, if driverless cars prove successful on the road and significantly lower accident rates, is there a possibility where ALL vehicles on the road are required to have this technology? Would this result in opening up a world of self-driving motorcycles? Though far from likely, these are examples of the many questions being raised. Answers to these questions will largely be dependent on time and the success or failure of this new technology.
