The Freedom Of Road Riders® membership patch and yearly chevrons can be worn only on the front of any garment. This shall also apply to any patch or design created to designate a Local or District of Freedom Of Road Riders® ONLY event patches may be worn on the back of garments. Patches created to designate FORR® or Freedom of Road Riders®, Local District, or Event shall not be larger than 13 square inches in area.

# Event Insurance

I think there may still be a little confusion on the requirement of our insurance as far as definitions is concerned. Of the request for coverage is coming in this year I'm seeing a difference in the requirements this year versus last year.

There is times when the other party is asking for one of two different certificates from us. The most common has been to be listed as an Additional Insured on our policy. When this is the request what they are saying is if there is a problem I want you to protect me on your policy. As the insurance company is extending coverage for the 3rd party there is a charge of \$62.50 and this will take me time to get it. That is the reason for 30 days prior to event.

The other is just a Certificate of Proof of Insurance. This is just a request from the other party for us to prove that we are responsible and actually have Insurance. This is not a distrust as it is quite common in the commercial business. It is a certificate issued proving that we do have Insurance and there is NO cost for them.

So Please when the 3rd party ask, make for sure you understand what they are asking for. If Dallas receives a request for a Certificate of Insurance and that is what she requests of me then 2 or 3 days before the event the city requires you to provide an ADDITIONAL INSURED Certificate it is possible it may not be able to get it and they may not let you have your event.

Why the difference is because if they let you have the event and they are not listed and we have a major loss then their insurance will have to pay and their rates will go up or it may not even be covered under their policy. Then we get SUED big time for their loss.

If in doubt please call Dallas and she will contact me. If Dallas is not available the call me at the office between 9:00 am and 6:00 pm Mon. through Friday at 660- 885-5741. This is only if you cannot reach Dallas.

I hope this clarifies it for everyone if not call Dallas or Email her with your questions. Please just don't assume.

I suspect I am more like most BIKERS than not, yet most BIKERS are not supporting members of the MRF. I can only surmise as to the reasons why, but rather than blab away about why you SHOULD be a supporting member of the MRF, I am going to tell you why I think you should NOT be.

If you choose to be an apathetic individual, not interested in politics, law, government intrusion, or your constitutionally protected rights, save the annual \$30 support membership cost, as you have no use for the MRF. That 30 bucks'll get you an evening's belly full of beer and you're a winner.

If you don't have a problem with Uncle Sam taking your money for licenses, registrations, fees, and fines, in whatever amount and for whatever reason Uncle Sam decides, you should not support the MRF. Consider it your patriotic duty.

Are you paying attention to these motorcyclist concerns? WE ARE!

We do not segregate ourselves by the brand, or type of motorcycle people ride. We do not care what race, creed, sex, or religious affiliation anyone has. We do not care if you're a MC member, a lone wolf, or a former or wannabe rider.

If you're a veteran organization member, a HOG member, or a member of any state or national rights organization, WE are the recognized grassroots biker organization that carries weight in Washington D.C.

If you love the freedom our creator endowed us with at birth, and believe in the Declaration of Independence and Constitution our founding fathers wrote to GUARANTEE us keeping those rights....you should be a member of the MRF.

The Buck Stops Here Award criteria. The saying "the buck stops here" derives from the slang expression "pass the buck" which means passing the responsibility on to someone else.

President Harry Truman had a wooden sign on his desk which read "The Buck Stops Here". In his farewell address to the American people given in January 1953, President Truman referred to this concept very specifically in asserting that, "The President--whoever he is--has to decide. He can't pass the buck to anybody. No one else can do the deciding for him. That's his job.

The Buck Stops Here award is the highest award presented by Freedom of Road Riders.

It was designed to recognize those individuals who have served this organization in ways that have left a profound and lasting impact upon Freedom of Road Riders and motorcycle rights in this state and beyond. They are leaders. They are dreamers. They are driven to protect the rights of motorcyclists. They are the ultimate Freedom Fighters.

Eligibility:

The individual being nominated (nominee) must be a current member of FORR and have been a member of FORR for a minimum of ten (10) years at the time of the nomination.

No posthumous nominees will be considered for this award.

The nominee may not be a current corporate officer of FORR, Inc. Current officer standing shall be determined as of the date of nomination.

Nomination Process:

The person submitting the nomination (nominator) must be a current member of FORR and must have been a member of FORR for a minimum

of five (5) years at the time of the nomination.

If additional FORR members wish to show their support of the individual being nominated, those individuals may indicate their support of the nominee by placing their full name and membership number below the name and membership number of the individual submitting the nomination. Supporting individuals shall not be required to meet the nomination requirements.

All nominations shall be made in writing, shall contain a detailed description of how this individual has made a profound and lasting impact upon Freedom of Road Riders and motorcycle rights in this state, and shall contain the full name and FORR membership number of the nominator. Written nominations shall be submitted to the FORR General Office no later than October 1. Nominations submitted by U.S. mail must be postmarked on or before October 1 for consideration. Nominations shall be considered confidential and shall only be shared with past Buck Stops Here award recipients.

Nominations shall not carry over from year to year.

A call for nominations shall be published in the July, August and September Freedom Press, which publication shall contain the above award description and award requirements.

The Award:

The award shall consist of the following:

A Missouri State Flag which has been flown over the Missouri State Capitol at the behest of a sitting Missouri legislator.

The Missouri State Flag shall be presented in a square wooden presentation box with a glass front with a 1 ½" by 4" blue plate inscribed with the following words:

F.E.W. Seminar (date)

The "Buck Stops Here" Award  
(Recipient's Name)

A framed certificate from the legislative sponsor to the BSH recipient explaining the history of the Missouri State Flag. A framed certificate from the Governor stating that the flag was flown in honor of the BSH recipient.

A "Buck Stops Here" patch.

The General Office shall be responsible for ordering the Missouri State Flag from an appropriate legislative sponsor, obtaining the necessary frames for the award and assembly of the award with the help and recommendations of past BSH award recipients. All costs incurred for the components of the award shall be paid out of the F.E.W. Seminar budget.

Voting on the Award Nominees:

Voting shall be made by submission of all written nominations to all past BSH award recipients no later than October 15th. The recipient of the BSH award shall be decided by a majority vote of the past BSH recipients. In the event of a tie vote, a revote shall be taken which includes only those nominees involved in the tie vote.

Presentation of the Award:

The Buck Stops Here award shall be presented at the F.E.W. Seminar by the previous recipient of the BSH award. In the event this individual is unable to perform these duties they shall be performed by the next previous recipient. Only one Buck Stops Here award will be awarded in a calendar year. As this is a very prestigious honor there may be years when the award is not presented.

I'd like to finish this month with a few thoughts about my fallen Brother John Stouffer. I had the immense pleasure of working with John for many years both as an officer of local 12 and with some of his legislative efforts. John was old school and didn't do computers so I was his internet source. I especially remember when John was working with Melanie Coy of local 16 on some state legislation that would affect bikers in this state. Melanie would e-mail me the things that John needed to see, then I would call John and would come to our house in Marshall and review what she sent. I was kind of a surrogate secretary to two people that I both loved and respected.

John was a walking encyclopedia when it came to legislation, parliamentary procedure, and the nuts and bolts of law making. Woe be it unto any meeting chairman that missed a second or didn't know how to deal with amendments on the floor. He was our CC rep and legislative coordinator for more than a decade. Every report he gave back from the state meetings would have every fact straight, every committee report accurately summed up, every financial report perfect to the last decimal point. Perfect attendance awards for reps at CC meetings? John earned one every year. Legislative days at the Capitol? John would always be there.

Election years would put John into overdrive. He canvassed all the candidates, got their input, filtered out the bullshit, and told us all how it was. Someone running for the legislature in our district? Woe be unto them if they refused John's invite to a local 12 meeting. We once had lieutenant governor candidate Gracia Backer come all the way to John's house for one of our meetings. You can't appreciate the significance of that unless you had been to John's house. John's home address WAS Bumphuque, Egypt.

The times I will remember best were those I spent on the road with John. He had been a district commissioner in Saline county and knew the roads and places of interest in this state like the back of his hand. John introduced me to the best piece of coconut cream pie in Missouri in a little hole in the wall place in Jamestown. Back road where the cops never went? Shuck that helmet and enjoy the wind in your hair!

John had a special reverence for history and historical things, especially those involving motorcycles. He owned a whole stable of antique British bikes. His special pride and joy was his Vincent. He traveled all the way to Las Vegas to buy that bike when they auctioned off Steve McQueen's private collection. I remember when he rode it up to our house for the first time. Before he kicked it over, he said "Smokey, don't be alarmed at the idle noise, this sonuvabitch sounds like a coffee can full of rocks." John didn't grin a lot, but he always had a big shiteater when he rode that bike. To John, motorcycle didn't make mechanical noise, they played their own individual symphonies and he never tired of it. John had tuned every instrument in that machine's orchestra.

John's last bike was his new Indian and he loved that bike. Not only for the magnificent way it rode but because someone had finally successfully resurrected a glorious name from motorcycling's past. And they paid tribute to that past with big air cooling fins on the engine, the sweeping full coverage fenders, and the original Indian logo all over that powerplant. It was John's kind of bike. When you hear the word "oxymoron" what comes to mind? Military intelligence? Vacation Bible school? I'll give you the ultimate oxymoron: John Stouffer Gold Wing.

We sadly miss you, Brother, but we also thank our lucky stars that local 12 was blessed with your presence for so many years. You are irreplaceable and you will always be remembered. Godspeed, Brother.



Urge Congress to protect motorcycle racing  
Defend your right to race!

Members of both chambers of Congress have introduced versions of a bill that would prevent

the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency from regulating the conversion of street motorcycles and other motor vehicles into competition-only racers. The EPA failed to provide proper notice of this regulation, including it in an unrelated heavy-duty-truck regulation. The proposed rule would hurt thousands of amateur and professional motorcycle racing enthusiasts and the millions of fans who enjoy motorcycle competition.

The bi-partisan Recognizing the Protection of Motorsports Act of 2016 (H.R. 4715 and S. 2659, RPM Act) would ensure that converting motor vehicles into competition-only vehicles remains legal. Street motorcycles are considered motor vehicles under the Clean Air Act.

The RPM Act was introduced in the House by U.S. Reps. Patrick McHenry (R-N.C.), Henry Cuellar (D-Texas), Richard Hudson (R-N.C.), Bill Posey (R-Fla.) and Lee Zeldin (R-N.Y.).

The Senate version was introduced by U.S. Sens. Richard Burr (R-N.C.), Shelley Moore Capito (R-W. Va.), Thom Tillis (R-N.C.) and Dean Heller (R-N.C.).

The act states that it was the clear intent of Congress when passing and amending the Clean Air Act that motor vehicles, including motorcycles, used solely for competition would be exempt from the Clean Air Act's prohibitions against modifying emission control devices.

The American Motorcyclist Association supports the bills and their protections for amateur and professional racing enthusiasts.

Tell your senators and representatives that you support S. 2659 and H.R. 4715. Send a prewritten email by using the easy-to-use AMA Action Center.

The AMA is coordinating efforts with the Specialty Equipment Market Association and other racing sanctioning bodies in support of the RPM Act. SEMA represents vehicle aftermarket manufacturers, marketers and distributors.

Why wasn't motorized recreation included in a major report?

Ask the publisher!

On March 31, the Pew Charitable Trusts released a report titled, "Quiet Recreation on BLM-Managed Lands: Economic Contribution 2014."

The report found "quiet recreation visitors to these BLM lands spent approximately \$1.8 billion ... in 2014. These expenditures resulted in overall contribution ... of approximately \$800 million in personal income, \$1.54 billion in value-added, economic output of over \$2.8 billion, and nearly 25,000 jobs."

However, the report does not include the economic benefits of responsible motorized recreation for reference. The Outdoor Industry Association concluded direct spending for "Off Roading" in the Western Governors Association region was more than \$27.1 billion. Moreover, the Pew report cited a combined OHV category (i.e., cars, trucks, SUVs and ATVs) as No. 2 in total visitor days in western states and Alaska.

With motorized recreation contributing greatly to the economic engine of the United States, the American Motorcyclist Association believes the significant economic activity of motorized recreation should have been properly referenced in this report or in a separately commissioned motorized-only recreation study.

Ask the Pew Charitable Trusts research center why motorized recreation was not referenced in the report.

## Report of Motorcycle Curfew Completely False

A recent report of a supposed curfew enacted by a number of states against motorcyclists has been making the rounds lately, and the Motorcycle Riders Foundation wishes to squelch this nasty little rumor before it gets a life of its own.

It appears that this false story has gained the interest of a lot of people, as many search engines are currently

bringing up "motorcycle curfew" as soon as you enter the word motorcycle—it's what the social media experts refer to as "trending." It pains the MRF to dignify this ridiculous story with a response; however, we appreciate motorcyclists' rights advocates paying attention when things like this come up and want to make sure accurate information is available. To be as clear as possible, there is no curfew being put into effect, and the story is completely false. The reasons that make the adoption of a curfew by a supposed eleven states absurd are far too numerous to address here, and this complete work of fiction is nothing more than an a bad attempt to either create momentum for some other cause or to serve as a distraction to true freedom fighters. Keep up the good work, it looks like we've got somebody worried.

**Motorcyclists Unite on Anti-Profiling Bill Language**  
Consistent with the Motorcycle Riders Foundation's (MRF) 2016 Legislative Agenda as voted on by its Sustaining State Motorcyclists Rights Organizations, the MRF has aligned with other national motorcyclists' rights organizations on proposed federal anti-profiling language. (The full version of the language can be read on our website at [www.mrf.org](http://www.mrf.org).)  
The MRF recognizes the importance to all motorcyclists of this much-needed language, and we applaud the hard work of organizations

that are addressing this issue legislatively on the state level. The time has come, however, to address profiling on a national level. There is a public misconception that profiling is strictly an issue that affects only motorcycle clubs; in reality, nothing could be further from the truth, as profiling injustices continue to happen across the country to all types of motorcyclists. This issue is a matter of civil liberties, and now is the time to roll up the sleeves and get to work.

To that end, at the most recent Anti-Profiling Action Group meeting in Las Vegas, ranking members from many motorcycling organizations all agreed to support anti-profiling language, including James "Doc" Reichenbach II, Chairman of the National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM), Frank Ernst, Chairman of the NCOM Legislative Task Force, and David "Double D" Devereaux, representing the Council of Clubs and author of this anti-profiling language. Other members of the Anti-Profiling Action Group include the Committee Lead Russell Radke, MRF President Kirk "Hardtail" Willard, Committee Secretary Shelly Holcomb, MRF PAC Treasurer Lenny Holcomb, and nationally known motorcyclists' advocate Dick "Slider" Gilmore.

As the true "boots on the ground" of motorcycling rights, the MRF is asking each of you to reach out to your federal legislators and ask them to support anti-profiling language. Time is of the essence—we need to know who will support us and who will not by May 1, two weeks prior to our "Bikers Inside the Beltway" national biker lobby day on May 12, 2016.

Please send all responses from your legislators—both those that are in favor and those that are against—to Russell Radke at [Russell@MRF.org](mailto:Russell@MRF.org). Russell will then forward all the compiled information to the MRF's analyst to compile into a list of talking points for the MRF's national biker lobby day known as Bikers Inside the Beltway to be held in Washington D.C. on May 12th.

## Anti-Profiling Victory at the State Level

Maryland recently passed an Anti-Profiling bill through both the House and Senate. Public Safety-Motorcycle Profiling-Training passed the Senate with a 47-0 vote and the House of Delegates with a 136-0 vote. Maryland would be the second state in the union joining Washington to pass an Anti-Profiling bill after a procedural vote across both bodies and a signature by the Governor.
