



Local 11 made a motion to approve the minutes as printed, Local 1, 2nd, the Motion passed unanimously with no discussion.

Chairman – Joe “DC” Karr – As most of you know coming here for the last 6 years, I've been on the cabinet in one capacity or another. This is my last meeting as chairman. I have a couple things to say to day during my segment. I wrote a couple things down. My fair-well speech. I was asked to end my chairmanship with dignity and grace and leave on a positive note. I intend to do that but I feel things need to be said. If any organization to service and thrive, there must be growth. A new way to accomplish goals exceeds expectations

and thrive in an ever-changing world and social environment. What worked 40 years ago will not work today in order to gain and retain members. This organization is stuck in rut that is only deepening because long time members refuse to change or accept that change must happen. In my 6 year on the state cabinet, I have seen proposals come and go, and I've talked to many members who have great ideas for this organization. New members that were full of fire and passion, but they never brought their ideas forward knowing they would be only be met with opposition and resistance from resistance from the long-time members. Why do you may ask? The answer is simply because this organization lives in the a we-have-always-done-it-this-way mindset and refuses to change it mentality and way of thinking. When you have an organization that constantly rejects a new idea you will have a mass exodus of members. When your membership numbers fall and you still refuse to see what is right in front of you, the proverbial writing on the wall and you still refuse to acknowledge it, you only have an organization that will die. Freedom of Road Riders was founded on a simple premise, it's in our Preamble, to fight for motorcyclists right. The right to choose what is right for us, freedom. But what happens when the same members who fought for us to have freedom of choice take that choice away? When those members refuse to change, refuse to see what is clearly written on the wall. The answer is, we have no freedom at all. We are an organization on decline and our days are numbered, they are numbered because we are stuck in the 70's and 80's mentality with members who are afraid to change, members who refuse to change. To that I say, failure is not fatal but failure to change, is. In conclusion, as an organization, the time for change is right now and the place is right here. You can't go back and change the beginning but you can start where you are now and change the ending. Thank you.

Duchess did contact US Bank regarding moving the Riders Ed money into a savings account. The money was not moved to a savings account. The best that was offered was .05% interest. The options for CD's are 5, 9 and 12 months. Yield for 5 months is \$400, 9 months \$600 and 12 months \$800.

Secretary – Marla Wallace in for Amy Allmon

Legislative Coordinator – Joe Widmer - Everyone needs to be aware that at some point we are going to be faced with the helmet bill again, not sure when. There has been coalition put together by the Head Injury Counsel. Joe went to both Speakers office and the Senate Pro tem office, there is no plan at the time to put the law back on the books. Anyone can follow along, can go to the House and Senate website. For many years, FORR has been working on getting Drivers Ed back into the high schools and adding a motorcyclist section. There are over 50 schools that still have drivers ed out of over 400 schools. Motorcycle lighting will be coming up again. Right now the only colors that can be used will in motion are amber and white. Right to repair for motorcycles only, will be another bill that will be pre-filed. Joe passed out the wording of House Bill No 705 regarding Lane Filtering and Lane Splitting.

MRF – Amy Allmon (*absent*)

Mid-South Mile – Roy “Cowboy” Hoard – The MSM hasn’t come to an end yet. It’s going to go back to its roots. There will be more information to come after the meeting in March. There were 98 silent auction baskets this year. The live auction had a number of large items.

Mentor Program – Mark Capps (*absent*)

Membership Coordinator – Trisha Ruby – Start up a conversation about FORR. Carry tri-folds with you to hand out. QR codes are getting printed on out T-shirts now. Try to send out a group text to all members to remind them of the local meeting.

Motorcycle Awareness Coordinator -Trisha Ruby – Scott from MHP regarding motorcycle crashes for September. There were 7 fatalities, 18 crashes. Some reasons were driving too fast to negotiate a curve, failure to stop, hit a deer, struck a dog, ran off right side of roadway. The PSA with Charlie Pilcher is still being seen on YouTube. Need to watch the Right to Repair bill. It can have a negative impact on the “Mom and Pop” shops.

Marketing Coordinator – Shauleen Capps – Social media content is concerned; views are increasing yet engaging is low. We need people to comment or react to a promote the post so that more people see the post. Sharing the post helps also. Remember, you can contact Green Printers in Marshall Mo for tri-folds.

Webmaster – Kathleen “Duchess” Karr – Still working on getting the past Freedom Press’s on the website. Check out the history of FORR. There is a “for sale” portion of the website if you have anything to sale.

Product Line – Shelly Noel – Lanyards will be added to the product line. They will be \$2 each. Shelly’s new email is Shellyblue2021@yahooc.com. She has hot pink, black sweatshirts, some hoodies. Sweatpants with and without elastic on the bottom. A catalogue has been started and will be added to the website in the future.

The Freedom Press – Michelle “Rebel” O’Connor – If there is a meeting place indicated in your local newsletter, they will receive a letter asking them to be a corporate sponsor. If they don’t want to be a corporate sponsor, ask if they would like to be a sustaining member. Letters will also be sent out to anyone that sends in a membership with a check that has a business on the check or a business card will be sent a letter to be a sustaining membership.

FEW Seminar – **Trisha Ruby** – It will be held March 11, 2025. Encourage new members to attend the FEW. Can always use the assistance from anyone that would like to volunteer to help put on the FEW.

Show-Me Rally – **Jim Fitzsimonds** – Need to get a budget for the bike give-a-way. The fund right now is \$18,480. The bike profit was a little over \$4000.00 back into the fund. Sold a majority of the bike tickets this year. Not all were sold. Going to get some banners to post for the rally. Jake High is open for any new ideas. He can be contacted at 417-540-3620. To reserve an RV spot, call 660-342-4729 after January 1st.

Old Business – Locals need to get their events planned farther in advance. Checks and sanction form need to be into Linda 45 days before the event to ensure your event goes smoothly. Signed waivers need to be sent back to Linda as soon as the event is over. Insurance renews April 16, 2026. There are 9 insurance events left to use by April. Each local was given guidelines for insurance to give to the local secretary. There are a couple options for the bike give-a-way at this time. There are a 2012 Heritage and 2018 Heritage. Local 1 set a budget cap at \$15,000 for the purchase of the bike for the Show-Me Rally, 2nd by local 24. Motion passed unanimously with some discussion. The new cabinet was voted in with Casey Singleton as Chairman, Jake High as Vice Chair, Trisha Ruby Secretary and Amy Allmon Treasurer. Marla Wallace is temporarily filling in for Amy Allmon. Vote by ballot was unanimous for the new Cabinet.





LEGISLATIVE UPDATE JANUARY 2026

As I have been telling everyone for the past year or so, it will finally happen, Senator Tracy McCreery filed SB 990 that could possibly reinstate the helmet law. Our job from this point going forward is to get this legislation killed or at least put on the back burner. What this means is that it never gets a committee hearing and monitoring every transportation bill that gets put on the floor of the Senate and hope that it doesn't get amended to any other bill. If it does then we have to make sure that the amendment doesn't pass. So this is going to be a busy year for each and everyone of us.

Now here's a list of all the legislation that I have found to this point that we are supporting or at least following.

- SB 990 – Sen. McCreery – Helmet Law
- SB 1050 – Sen. Fitzwater – Autonomous Vehicles
- SB 1283 – Sen. Carter – Liability Risks During Motocross Activities
- SB 1369 – Sen. Nicola – Enacts Provisions Related to Motorcycle Operations (Lane Filtering)
- HB 1660 – Rep. Seitz – Right To Repair Motor cycles Only
- HB 1831- Rep. Violet – Child Safety on Motorcycles and Motortricycles
- HB 1753 – Rep. Caton – Driver's Education
- HB 2069 – Rep. Phelps – Autonomous Vehicles

This is all the pre-filed bills that I have found as of today, December 3. There are a few that are missing but hopefully will get filed in the near future. They are; Motorcycle Lighting and another Driver's Education bill. I will hopefully have more information on these before our January meeting. So with everything being said here, we're going to have to be on top of our game this year and that requires the help of every motorcyclist in this state. Contacting your Senators and Representatives and coming to the Capitol and visiting with them to let them know how you feel about this legislation. The session starts, January 7, 2026.

Also Deanna is working on Veterans issues again this year so if you have any questions for her on veterans legislation please feel free to contact her. She is also a big part of getting Driver's Education going.

2026: A Compressed Calendar

The Critical Next 13 Months

As the nation emerges from the longest government shutdown in history, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) is preparing for a fast-paced and politically charged 13-plus months in Washington, D.C. Midterm election years always bring a compressed congressional schedule. 2026 will be no exception. On average, the U.S. House of Representatives meets just 130 days in even-numbered years. The Senate averages 142, which is roughly three weeks fewer than in non-election years. This condensed schedule means less time for Congress to legislate, debate, negotiate and even less time for groups like ours to ensure our priorities are heard. The 2025 government shutdown further reduced the year's "work days," leaving lawmakers with a backlog of unfinished business to address in the months ahead.

With razor-thin majorities in both chambers and Republicans maintaining narrow control, the political stakes will be high. The GOP will be under growing pressure to deliver tangible results before voters head to the polls in November. Reauthorization of the highway bill will be among the top priorities. It provides one of the most direct opportunities for both parties to advance their policy goals.

That's why sustained engagement by the MRF is more critical than ever. When Congress moves quickly, there's no time to introduce ourselves or educate new staff about our priorities. Success in these moments depends on preparation, relationships, reputation, and readiness built long before the legislative rush begins.

The MRF's government relations team continues active outreach with key committees, congressional offices, and regulatory agencies to ensure the voice of motorcyclists remains part of every relevant discussion. As these 13-plus months unfold, your involvement, your outreach, your stories, and your presence will be vital to securing the victories we need.

In a compressed political environment, preparation and persistence will determine success. By staying engaged and ready, the MRF and its members can continue to protect and advance the rights of all motorcyclists when opportunity strikes.


