

<u>Webmaster</u> – New Website should be 100% current with the information she has available. Local 20 indicated that they are very happy with the updated site. It has been past practice to receive permission from the family to post on the Memorial Page. We will reiterate that the permission or attempt to contact a family member to verify. Some have had issues with accessing the site on their phone that issue should be resolved with the new site. Duchess would like ideas or suggestions from members for ad.

<u>Awareness Coordinator</u> – Heather Peterson – absent. Setting up awareness booth at Bikefest and Jim volunteered to set up. He needs assistance in the booth, we will need to limit our time to 9am to 5pm on Saturday at Bikefest.

Legislative Coordinator – Joe Widmer – Veto session begins Wednesday. Joe is going to offer the returned campaign check as undelivered. State has a surplus of money and the Governor decided to return it to the people. Still discussing how that will take place. What legislation do we wish to pursue this term? Accident numbers have increased: helmet and no helmet numbers are about the same. There will be a challenge to the helmet issue if we don't get these numbers under control. The worse part is we are killing ourselves usually not the cagers fault. Education, safety, and sober riding, 56% of accidents are due to failure to negotiate the turn/curve, average age of a person who dies of

motorcycle accident is 54 and riding an HD. ATV/UTV must carry liability insurance if registered with the city/county to drive on the streets. A member was hit by an ATV and they were not insured, asked if that shouldn't be required if they are driving on the streets? Going to discuss with a Rep to see if a bill is necessary. Also, Texting and driving, driver's education, profiling resolution.

MRF – Amy Allmon – How many here are MRF members? Meeting of the Minds will be held in Des Moines, IA September 22-25 at Des Moines Marriot Downtown. Contact Kat Fox, Chris McCurley, or myself for more information. Missouri will host th3 2024 Meeting of the Minds and need to fund raise to cover the \$10,000-\$12,000 needed to pay for the event which will be held in KC or STL.

<u>Mid-South Mile</u> – Roy "Cowboy" Hoard – Will be held in Topeka, KS Oct 7-9 at Ramada Inn. Needed basket donations by today and Tami did not receive any items. Local 35 donated \$50, Local 29 \$20, Local 3 \$100.

Riders Education – Beth Clark – All the training bikes are sold except for the 2003 Nighthawk. Beth is officially no longer a coach due to health reasons. She will still run the program. Only the November 13-14 class has space left for students. BRC 2 will probably be cancelled since we have no students signed up. The ARC 8 students have signed up and still have 4 spaces left. Continue to donate a free class when we give away a bike at Homecoming. It can be transferred to another rider if necessary. Would like to receive approval for \$3,000 to use if/when a training bike becomes available for sale. Motion from Local 1 that we give the Riders Ed coordinator permission to spend up to \$3,000 on the purchase of a training bike 2nd by Local 10. Discussion regarding the selling of assets and the CC bodies approval of buying and selling of assets. Local 1 Amended the motion to add the approval of at least 2 cabinet members and 2nd by Local 31. Voice vote on the amendment all yeas and 1 nay vote and motion carries. Roll call vote on the original motion, 22 yea votes and 4 nay votes (2 locals absent). Motion passes.

<u>Membership</u> – Kat Fox. A local had a family event and a couple brought their children and were basically blackballed. It's upsetting because we are trying to grow and involve the younger generation. Encourage locals to have kid friendly events to involve the family. The couple dropped out of FORR. A tip that may draw attention would be multicolored trifolds and each local should attempt to print on their own trifolds. Bikefest coming up and will have membership booth in vendor village. Suggestion that we sell new memberships at Bikefest for \$20 and the Locals would forgo the \$5 from each membership. Local 11 made motion that we sign up new members at the Bikefest event for \$20, 2nd Local 10, unanimous voice vote.

<u>COCI Liaison</u> – Ken Lewis. Was not able to attend the COC meeting same weekend as CC meeting. We could use a volunteer to attend these meetings they are is usually in St Louis or Columbia area.

<u>Freedom Press</u> – Michelle "Rebel" O'Connor. Discussion regarding putting the newsletter on the Website. Do we want it to be members only or make available to the public? Need new ideas. Need a decision by November.

FEW Seminar – Jammie Tipton. March 11 although Jammie volunteered to coordinate but has not been able to attend a committee meeting this year. We will contact her to ask if she willing to allow another to take over. We don't know her plans but will discuss with her to get an answer. A discussion was had regarding committee volunteers, we need them to be able to commit to attending at least three committee meetings a year.

Homecoming – Joe "DC" Karr. Reminder, Today is September 11, NEVER FORGET! Total Homecoming attendance was 359, 97 day passes on Saturday, 86 nonmembers, 176 members. Your Vice Chairman was disappointed in our attendance numbers. Only ten locals showed up and only ten locals sponsored the event. \$8,880 income from the bike, \$511 from 50/50 drawing, \$1,000 band sponsors, \$300 banner sponsors, \$1,200 stage sponsors. Donation of \$192, \$8,060 entry fees, RV \$1,585, T-shirt sponsor \$850, Trophy sponsors \$650, vendor fees \$1,250. Total income \$24,478. Expenses: Bike Giveaway \$3,124.16, campground fees \$3,500, Concert fee \$4,600, Dumpster Fee \$566.75, Golf carts \$1,560.36, Miscellaneous event expenses \$824.07, Office supplies \$1149.18, Printing supplies \$268.39, Port A Potties \$1,550. Profit \$8,335.10. Income from Product Line \$375. Net Profit \$8,710.10. Next year needs to bigger and better. Another bike giveaway that we need to step up from a Sportster. Need a new Human games coordinator. District 4 gets \$150 for the delivery and set up of the Gate booth, DIK. This year District 4 also brought the large tent for the bike show and would like to obtain an additional \$150 DIK for the delivery and setup of the tent. Motion made by Local 14 for the DIK of a total of \$300 (\$50 for each local in District 4, which are 1,5,14, 29, 33, 35) for the delivery and set up of the Gate Booth and Tent for Homecoming, 2nd by Local 29. Passed by unanimous voice vote. Need to increase the seed money or move money to the giveaway account to continue the Bike Giveaway. We will find a Street Glide or Dyna for \$5000 and include that in the budget to be presented in January.

Old Business - None found. Updated Bylaws were provided.

<u>New Business</u> – The Pulaski County Shrine Club (Freedom Rally, Buckhorn, MO) is doing electrical upgrades and if the Local has a pavilion on the grounds you need to contact Kevin Cordry (573)586-9801 he needs information from the owners. An email containing the updated bylaws was sent to Local secretaries and presidents.

A motion to adjourn was made by Local 11 and Local 7 2nd motion passed with unanious voice vote.



I seem to remember that a lot of the "rats" were English bikes which of course made the prospect of the thing breaking down even more likely. (Lucas) Back then, the ride went from Joe's shop to Pere Marquette State Park near Grafton, IL where there were drag races and other festivities. If you wanted to, for I think \$5, you could bet on how far the Rat would go before breaking down or running out of fuel. These were some of the greatest of my early street riding times. I rode the first 6 or seven of them on my 1946 WL. Good times.

Last Sunday, I asked around at the various stops if anyone had seen Joe at this event. None that I asked had. I lost touch with him years ago. I was following him on fakebook before I bailed out of that hell hole. Last I heard, he was working for the National Motorcycle Museum in Iowa. Joe was a pillar of the motorcycle community in this area and a good friend of mine for a while. Joe always had Flathead parts! 
