### Central Committee Meeting #248 May 2, 2021

Freedom of Road Riders®, Inc. Central Committee Meeting was held on Sunday, May 2, 2021 at the American Legion Post #5. Jefferson City, MO. **Webmaster** – *absent* – Website has issues, we should research the cost of upgrading the service. The Cabinet will get with Mike and discuss options and costs then report back to CC body.

**Awareness Coordinator – Deanna Rhodes** – Thanks to Local 24 for selling \$71 worth of magnets. Heather Dunham from Local 2 will be taking over for Deanna. Deanna has been using her own canopy and table. Motion made Local 30, 2nd Local 22 to budget \$200 for Heather to purchase same for her use from the Awareness fund. Motion passed ‘ unanimous voice vote. District 4 has two large canopies and tables that belong to legislative and stored. Available for use.

**MAY Rally** – 48 people signed in and speakers lined-up, but Senate was in session and unable to get away. The Governor spoke then went out and checked out the bikes. Tri-folds have been revamped and Tami is still taking suggestions for changes. Kim Lortin has volunteered to take over membership. Awareness booths: Local 1 that gave out MODOT magnets and keychains, Local 11 in Neosho that they attend every year. Local 24 were able to sign up 6 new members and renewed 5 members also sold magnets 2 for 1, purchase ours for \$1 and get the MODOT magnet for free, everyone loves a deal. Local 42 put 100 signs around town in yards and at businesses. Items available: t-shirts, magnets, keychains, lip balm, email [scott.wilson@modot.mo.gov](mailto:scott.wilson@modot.mo.gov). MODOT requested to have a booth at homecoming, after much discussion it was decided “NO” because it would be a conflict of interest. Deanna needs help in the booth at Homecoming.

**Legislative Coordinator** – Joe Widmer. HB 661 – omnibus bill allowing ground lights of any color instead of just amber or white, changing the autocycle definition to include handlebars not just steering wheel. Profiling resolution, SCR 9 could

make it to the floor next week. There are only two weeks left in the session and time is running out. Lincoln Days, June 11-12 Westin Crown Center still checking on the schedule and availability. Will need some folks to man the room.

**MRF** - Amy Allmon – Bikers Inside the Beltway is scheduled in May and instead of going to DC I will be visiting our S enators and Representatives in their local offices and will need a constituent to go with me. Please contact me if you are in US House District 1 Cory Bush and District 2 Ann Wagoner. Contact me, see info in the Freedom Press. I sent out a call to action form the MRF: The Highway Bill is up for renewal and we would like the Motorcycle Advisory Committee to remain funded in the bill. Next Meeting of the Minds is in Atlanta, GA, September 23-26. The CQ Engage software can be used for State issues also. I can put the Legislative Coordinator in contact with Dave Dwyer who can take care of that.

**Mid-South Mile – Roy “Cowboy” Hoard** – October 22-24, 2021, it will be held at the MCM Elegante Hotel, Dallas, TX. Tami is charged with gathering the items for the basket. She is donating a T-bag for the bike and would like items to place in the bag for our donation. Please bring all donated items to the September CC meeting (in August).

**Riders Education – Beth Clark (absent)** – Ken received a report from Beth which he read and will be condensed for space. Beth had surgery April 1 complications ensued and she has lost her job. At this point no classes this year except for the 3 Wheel Course September 17-19, Spyders are allowed on the range again and Rykers are allowed if supplied by Can-Am for training. Mike Russell was to attend Rider Coach Prep in April but due to circumstances beyond his control such as Covid last year and failure of others to provide all the information for this year.

Coach Paul Geer does not want to coach his first classes this year alone and Coach Doug Clawson is not currently certified but just needs to submit background check and prints and he will be recertified not scheduling classes until then. Coach Chuck Buck may be available for fall classes. Ben Keller of Local 15 has expressed interest in coaching we hope that his paperwork can be complete and be able to take the RCP in 2022. The classroom at Candlewood Suites is now being used by the National Guard. So, what do you do when the Guard gets in the way, you call the Marines! Classes will now be held at the Marine Corps League in Apache Flats. It is closer to the range but costs and additional \$50 per weekend but it is larger.

Doug will still maintain the bikes for the \$100 per month stipend and gas to transport to Jefferson City but cannot transport them when we have classes. Larry Neill (previously of Larry's Honda) has a fenced area with gates for a cost of \$50 a month for 12 months no contract needed. A Local 10 member has agreed to transport from storage to range 2 miles away which will not even it out, but we were paying Doug \$50 for gas every class. Doug is going to prepare a list of bikes we can sell. We need to restripe the range and some of the lines need to be remeasured and some redone for BRC2, ARC and 3 Wheel. Doug will help and has done it before, but I was hoping to hire a company so that we are not responsible if done incorrectly. So, if you have experience or know of a company or person in the business contact me at safety@forn.net. The safety program has the stripping equipment and MMSP has supplied the paint. Gypsy Rider's Ed is in a holding pattern until we can determine how we will be going forward. BL has observed there are not enough instructors in the State and the Director wants to scrap this program and institute his program being used in CA, WA, and OR. We only have one site remaining and too many bikes. Local 14 made a motion 2nd by Local 1 to reimburse Mike the \$189.44 for his costs. Passed unanimous voice vote.

**Membership – Kim Lortin**. Possible site for a Booth location at Lake of the Ozarks Bike Fest, September 15-19 in front of Summertime USA near Leatherman. We will set up 4 hour shifts so volunteers are needed for 11am to 5pm. I will set up a dedicated email for the membership information and replies. Is the information out on social media helping? Is it noticeable? Let Chips know if you need stuff posted to social media. We added a line to the trifold to ask how you heard about us? We are removing some extraneous lines that are not used. Do you know there are incentives for recruiting new members? The by-laws may need to be updated to further define time limits. When handing out a trifold or membership card fill in your name to receive credit. Local 2 issued a challenge they will receive the trophy for the largest percentage of growth again next year, try to beat them! Each local can offer an incentive to recruit new members.

**COCI Liaison – Ken Lewis**. They have offered to FORR an official position of essentially legislative coordinator and would have a seat at the table. Since we are not members, we would not have a vote. After discussion, a motion was made by Local 22 and 2nd by Local 5 to respectfully decline the official position but will continue to attend meetings and provide information. Passed by unanimous voice vote.

**Product Line – Shaulene Capps**. Shaulene and Mark will be resigning at the end of the year. They will still be available to produce things if needed. We really appreciate all the support, but they need to reorganize their life to focus on the family. She will honor all commitments made. **Freedom Press – Michelle “Rebel” O'Connor**. Thanks to those who are keeping her apprised of Freedom Press receipts. Seems to be a problem in the St. Louis and Southeast area. Submissions must be received at editor@forn.net by the 5th of each month and put Local number in the subject line.

**Social Media Coordinator** – Our posts reached 10,000 in March, and nearly 13,000 in April. There were 673 page views this month and 60 new likes and followers. The more we like and share the more attention we get. Created a photo album of event flyers by the month so that select events using a calendar format which you can share with others. When people contact her about joining or rider's ed directing them to the website is a crapshoot whether it works or not. We do not yet have a large following on MeWe but we are reaching people. We do have an Instagram account check it out, our hashtags are #freedom of road riders, #FORR, #motorcycle rights organization and #missourimotorcycles. The Facebook page has a feature I am posting photos of bike with and little info about the rider. So, send a photo of you and your bike with a bio of yourself and be "The Bike of the Day". **FEW Seminar – Jammie Tipton/Joe "DC" Karr.** Introducing 2022 FEW coordinator, Jammie Tipton from Local 2. Final numbers from FEW 2021: attendance 135, 38 more than last year. Expenses: Dragon – ball give away \$100, patches \$221, new trophy \$76 (membership fund), Legion \$1,794, Miscellaneous \$37.09, guest speaker hotel \$181.26, total \$2,409.35. Total income \$7,100.71 for a net profit \$4,691.36. FEW scheduled for March 12, 2022, here at American Legion Hall. We were tight so will try new table configuration. Our goal is 175 open for suggestions for a theme and use command strips for banners. Need live and silent auction baskets, prefer 2 baskets per local please. Ducks will be taken care of by Kerri as usual.

**Homecoming – Joe "DC" Karr.** Trash 30-yard dumpster, Kings Cart for carts with lights if unavailable will make other arrangements. 20 Porta-potties plus 2 hand washing stations \$1,200. Last year we did not spend any money on advertising, this year DC went to local printer and got 12x18 banner for \$480, no date or phone number will attach vinyl overlays each year. Security be nice but firm, be fair and consistent also sober. Donna Hilburn is chief will have radios, there will be a sign out for the radios and golfcarts then sign back in at end of shift. Sign-up sheets are available for security and gate duty. Trophies will be license plates again from product line. Friday's band is The Dirty Saints and Saturday's band is Love Bomb. In order to make money you gotta spend money, so we have a sound guy to increase the volume. Sponsor forms are available, challenge to all locals to obtain sponsors equal to or greater than \$450. Bike games and stupid human games. The pickle licking game, Slippin slid kick ball and drinking with arm attached to a TINS Unit with solo cups. Any other ideas contact DC. Dean and Dave with bring the shuttle tractor. Local 15 in charge of the bike show and will have a tent. RV reservations are currently full. Montrose VFW will be the alcohol vender, moving beer tent closer to the stage. Games will behind the beer tent. Local 2 has the big product line tent and put up for shade. AS you are aware that Bob has passed away and he was the vendor coordinator, so Ken Lewis has stepped in to take over. Set in stone T-shirt and trophy sponsor turned in July 31, 2021, all others can be taken until day of the event. Local 1 made motion the Local 15 be allowed DIK for the cost of the Bake show tent, 2nd Local 16, passed by unanimous voice vote. Wednesday, August 18 set up day, Vendors can arrive after noon on Thursday, Aug 19. On site meeting June 13, 1pm. Bike give away tickets available. Local 1 made a motion for the District 4 front gate trailer as a DIK \$150 for the 6 locals, 2nd by local 5, passed by unanimous voice vote. The bridge has been widened and no vendor vehicles will be on the road.

**Old Business** – Motion made by Local 11 to bring back to the table a motion to purchase a permanent sponsor paver for the American Legion Hall, 2nd by Local 1. 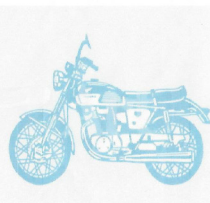

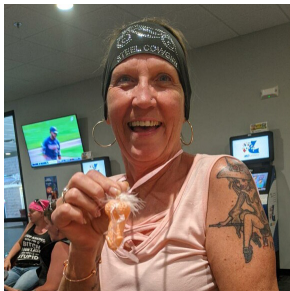

It is time, once again, to celebrate our country's birthday and yet we truly have so much more to be grateful for. We are FINALLY getting our lives back to the new "normal," and this we salute as well! "HAPPY and safe 4th of July to ALL!"

Summer is officially here, after what seems like an eternity of rainy, washed out riding days. And with the summer months comes the extreme temperatures and high humidity. So, I wanted to talk very briefly on things we can do to help with riding in the excessive heat.

Some people are of the belief that wearing less clothing during the heat is a way to stay cooler, but that is not necessarily true. Light colored and light weight clothing helps prevent sun and wind from drying your skin, and also will prevent getting burned. Mesh jackets will protect you, while also allowing cooling air to circulate your body.

The most important thing you can do is to remain hydrated.... drink lots of water! Sport drinks are also beneficial and will replace electrolytes you have lost as well as fluids. Try and drink before you feel parched and thirsty. You may think this will cause you to have to make "pit stops" more often, but your body will use that water as a cooling source while you sweat.

So, if you are riding and feel the heat; stop often, find shade or a cool place to rest, and drink fluids. You may want to wet down your t-shirt and bandanna, or use one of the awesome neck-gel packs that you soak in cold water and they help keep you cool for hours. Listen to your body, it will "tell you" when the heat is getting to you. Ride safe, my friends~ **"Coop"**

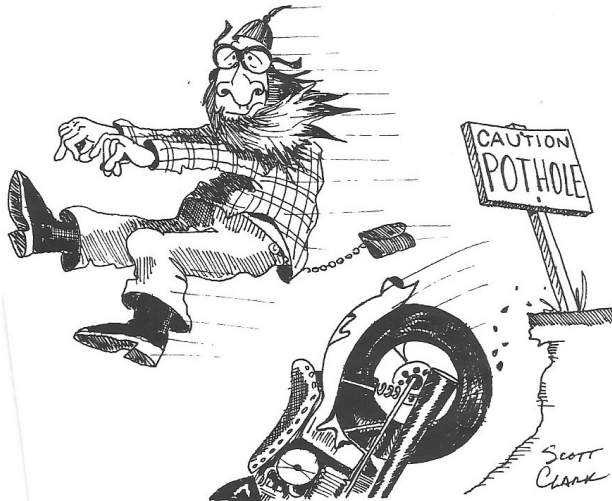

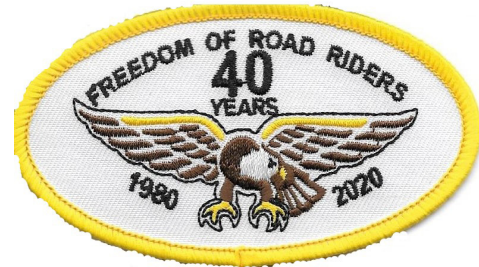

# MRF Report

Responsible and law-abiding motorcyclists across the country continue to report instances of being harassed and singled out by law enforcement simply because they are riding a motorcycle or wearing motorcycle-related apparel. Understanding this, in 2018 the U.S. Senate unanimously passed a resolution focused on the topic. Additionally, coast to coast state legislatures are introducing bills and resolutions to end the profiling of bikers.

Despite these successes the House of Representatives has failed to follow the lead of the U.S. Senate and state lawmakers by going on record about the need to end the profiling of bikers. Last month Congressman Tim Walberg of Michigan reintroduced a House version of an anti-profiling resolution which gained 138 cosponsors during the 116th Congress.

The updated version of the resolution, H. Res 366, now needs to match or surpass the cosponsor total from last year. Let's help Congressman Walberg gain cosponsors and finally get this resolution passed!

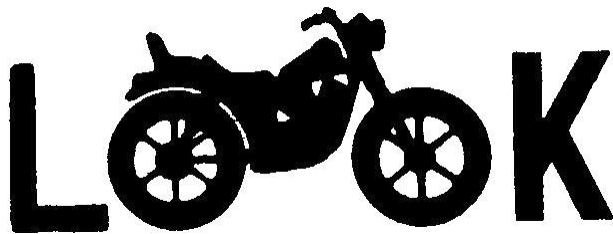
